Action Plan for 2015/2016

- Connections to BC Curriculum (new document)
 - Using school Pro D days to determine ways to integrate 'Education Through the Arts' concept in all curricular areas and infusing aspects of Aboriginal culture
 - o An Aboriginal Writer will be visiting GE to share the experience of being an author
 - Grade 4/5's visiting the Vancouver Art Gallery to be exposed to authentic aboriginal art. They will be visiting the Gund Exhibit http://www.vanartgallery.bc.ca/the exhibitions/exhib

o Kindergarten class using the school wide theme of 'Environments' to learn about their roots and of the people that were here before their ancestors.

o Div 6 (grade 3), Div 7 (2/3) and Div. 8 (½) worked on a unit of inquiry on wolves. Part of the the literature involved stories and legends around this important symbol of aboriginal life. They incorporated the arts by creating paper masks and doing a dance that was performed out in the forest.





- First Peoples Principles of Learning (how will you embed these in your work with students this year?)
 - Dedicated staff meeting time to discuss all principles of learning and how to embed throughout the curriculum.
 - o Staff is committed to introducing principles in a unit of study this year
- Parent Education (Native and Non-Native)
 - L. Tomlinson invited to PAC meeting to discuss how new curriculum will impact the way we infuse aboriginal content
 - Liaising with parent, Rachel Clearwater, about Orange Shirt day for next year and how we can include the whole school community. Rachel is an instructor at CAP
- Community

 - o Working with Squamish weavers to create weaving to explore our school wide theme of "Environmental Roots"
