Work Experience

Students work 90-100 hours to develop employability skills and explore careers they are interested in

Youth Work in Trades

Students work 120 hours in an apprenticeable trade and build their apprenticeship hours

Those who work 900+ hours and maintain a C+ average receive an extra \$1000 scholarship from the government

Youth Train in Trades

Students complete level one of an apprenticeable trade (equivalent to year one at an institution


