Mindset Matters Screening & Panel Discussion

Mindset Matters is a 45-minute documentary capturing the stories of for students participating in a entrepreneurial learning program where they are tasked with creating their own business ventures, highlighting students need to learn entrepreneurial skills including problem solving, creativity, critical thinking and social responsibility to succeed in tomorrow's economy.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

<u>Comprehensive School Health – Kelly Richter</u>

- The committee met on April 8
- Recap of sleep week; plan to continue with a sleep awareness event next year, details to be discussed at the May meeting
- Mental Health & Wellbeing Symposium held May 10, participants included administrators, teachers, school counsellors, parents and health care providers in our community. Well attended event; feedback and next steps from the workshop to be disseminated at a future date.
- Measles vaccinations catch up letters going home to families, community health clinics set up to help families get up to date with vaccinations. Vaccination rates lower than expected in WVSD.

Finance & Facilities – Danielle Katerberg

Finance & Facilities meeting — April 9, 2019

- Facilities Work completed over Spring Break included repairs, painting, pressure washing etc. at various sites.
- A new snow removal plan was successfully implemented this winter, with the majority of work
 done by facilities staff, reducing the expense of contracting it out. This resulted in significant costs
 savings.
- The Irwin Park project is now pretty much complete. The drainage issue is being managed and upon further review, is not going to require the large-scale drainage upgrade that was expected.
- Ridgeview will be getting a new boiler and four air handling units.
- Sentinel Gym update:
 - After reviewing the proposed project with an architect, project manager, geotechnical consultants, structural and mechanical engineers, it became clear that the scope of the project was much larger than anticipated. The difficult decision to cancel the project was made.
 - Sentinel staff have worked out a scheduling plan to allow PE classes and the fencing academy to share the Field House gym.
- The 19/20 preliminary operating grant was reviewed; we can expect a status quo budget for next year.

Human Resources – Andy Franks Absent/No report given

Traffic Safety Advisory Committee – Lynne Palmer

- Reminder \$300 grant towards traffic safety initiatives, ie bike safety road seminars for students
- School Maps all schools have been done. Cypress Park has draft version, Westcot is still to be done, Gleneagles has an old map, to be updated.
- Traffic Safety Initiatives calendar for the year "snapshot" to be posted online
- HUB Cycling Bike to School Week May 27-31. Is not just about biking to school, is an encouragement for "alternative" modes of transportation into the school (ie, park a few blocks away, and walk in).
- Crosswalk training Lynne is inquiring about access to training parent volunteers
- Please email Lynne regarding what has worked to solve your traffic and safety problems.
- Any concerns, please contact your school principal to help coordinate before bringing concerns to Lynne.

Board of Education Trustees Report – Carolyn Broady

- Status quo budget. Slight increase to per pupil funding.
- Labor negotiations with BCTF. Working hard, long way from finding common ground. Hoping to have a deal by June 30, committed to making it happen. Not communicating with media, negotiating in good faith,
- Spring celebrations at schools in full swing.
