Questions to consider when attending the Canadian University Event (CUE) Sep.28 at Rockridge Secondary, 6:30PM - 8:30PM

Here are some questions that will get you thinking about post secondary and all of the things you should know before you make your decision. Take some time to sit down with your friends or family to review these questions in order to make the most of the Canadian University Event

Ask yourself the following questions before you come to CUE:

Is there a specific career I'm interested and if so what are the requirements to become involved?
What schools offer these courses?
If I can't identify a specific career to target, what programs or courses interest me?
Which subject(s) am I good at?
How many years do I plan to be in university or college?
How will I pay for university?
Is living at home a possibility/preference?
Can I afford to live away from home?
If I decide to leave home, do I have friends or family in that location that can help me?
Do I want to attend a small, medium or large university?
Is the look and feel of the campus I choose important to me?
Do I want to go to a school that offers co-op or internship opportunities?
Will the school I'm interested in prepare me for doing graduate studies if that is important?

Attending CUE will give you a chance to speak to university representatives. The following questions will help you find out more about the universities that interest you.

Admission Requirements:

What courses are required in order to be admitted into the programs that interest me?
Are there additional requirements for admission to the program I am interested in?
What was the minimum average required for this program last year?
Do you accept on line or correspondence courses?
Do you accept challenge courses in the grade point average?
What if I have taken a course twice, does that affect my average?
Are there other English requirements if I am not a Canadian resident?
Can I get credit for AP or IB courses I have taken?
Do I apply directly to the school or through a centralized application centre?

Program:

Does your university have the program that interests me?
Does your university offer any unique programs?
Where can I get more information about a particular program?
Can I do an international exchange in conjunction with this degree?
Does your university offer opportunities to do a Co-op or an internship?
Does your institution help me find a Co-op or is it up to me?
If I did a Co-op or internship how much longer would I be in school?
Are there research opportunities for undergraduate students and if so when?
How big will my first year classes be?
Are special opportunities available for high academic achievers?

Finances:

What are the costs involved in attending your university for one year?
If I did a Co-Op or internship how much money could I make?
Do you award scholarships automatically or do I need to apply?
What are the criteria for your scholarships and when are the amounts determined?

Lifestyle:

How do I apply for residence?
Is residence guaranteed?
What kind of residence do you offer first year students?
What type of meal plan is offered with residence?
What varsity sports are available?
Are fees to access to the sports facilities included in my school fees?
What clubs and associations are available to first year students?
Is there campus support services offered especially for new students?
Are there smaller colleges associated with your university?
Is there some type of transit pass included in student fees?

When do you start taking applications?
What are the deadlines for applying to your university?
Do you make early offers based on grade 11 marks?
Can I self report my grades or do I send transcripts?
