Dear Mike,

It was good seeing you at the launch of the West Vancouver Place for Sport late last month. I would like to thank you and Council, on behalf of West Vancouver Schools and the West Vancouver Board of Education for the generous donation you made on behalf of the District of West Vancouver. I would like to also commend the work that has been done to date by staff at both the District of West Vancouver and West Vancouver Schools pertaining to the upgrade and replacement of the track and field at West Vancouver Secondary School. The collaboration between our offices has been impressive and I'm very pleased that we have such a strong working relationship as it benefits our schools and our community.

I also wanted to follow up on our previous conversations regarding the parking restrictions on the 1500 block of Mathers Avenue, outside of WVSS and the Kay Meek Centre. While we feel that it is necessary to keep parking restrictions in place from 8am-4pm, to prevent students parking there during extremely busy pick up and drop off times, I believe it would be worthwhile reviewing the late afternoon and evening restrictions. Many of the Kay Meek patrons are older and have mobility issues and if more level parking could be provided, near to the entrance of the Kay Meek, it could help them navigate more easily. I would be happy to discuss the matter further or provide more information as needed.
