### C. BOARD HIGHLIGHT

# <u>Bowen Island Community School</u> – Fostering Community, Excellence, and a Sense of Belonging Through our School Musical

BICS highlighted their production of "101 Dalmatians Kids", showcasing how the musical fostered literacy, confidence, and a strong sense of belonging. Through targeted reading interventions and wide student involvement—from acting to set design—the experience supported FESL goals and connected students, families, and staff in meaningful ways.

# <u>Caulfeild Elementary -</u> The Empathy Initiative – A School-Wide Approach to Building Empathy and Supporting our Community

Caulfeild Elementary shared "The Empathy Initiative", a project focused on fostering a deeper sense of belonging and social responsibility. Students explored how empathy can drive meaningful action by partnering with local organizations like Backpack Buddies. make a big difference—strengthening both community connections and their own sense of purpose.

Eagle Harbour students brought science to life through a three-day, project-based learning experience at the Pacific Science Enterprise Centre. Working alongside scientists and lab technicians over several months, students developed hypotheses, designed experiments, collected data, and presented their findings at a mini research conference—gaining real-world insight into the scientific process.

### 2. <u>Finance & Facilities Committee Meeting – April 1, 2025</u>

The second meeting discussed the preliminary budget operating grant for 2025-26, and the funding awarded under the 2025-26 5-Year Capital Plan, which will support Phase I of the building envelope upgrade at West Bay Elementary and fund phase II of the district-wide PA system upgrades.

1775 <u>MOTION</u> THAT the Board approve A BYLAW of the BOARD OF EDUCATION OF SCHOOL DISTRICT NO.45 (WEST VANCOUVER) (herein called the "Board").

WHEREAS in accordance with section 142 of the *School Act*, the Board of Education of School District No. 45 *(West Vancouver)* has submitted a capital plan to the Minister of Education (hereinafter called the "Minister") and the Minister has approved the capital plan or has approved a capital plan with modifications,

NOW THEREFORE in accordance with section 143 of the *School Act*, the Board has prepared this Capital Bylaw and agrees to do the following:

- (a) Authorize the Secretary-Treasurer to execute a capital project funding agreement(s) related to the capital project(s) contemplated by the capital plan or the capital plan with modifications;
- (b) Upon ministerial approval to proceed, commence the capital project(s) and proceed diligently and use its best efforts to complete each capital project substantially as directed by the Minister;

- (c) Observe and comply with any order, regulation, or policy of the Minister as may be applicable to the Board or the capital project(s); and,
- (d) Maintain proper books of account, and other information and documents with respect to the affairs of the capital project(s), as may be prescribed by the Minister.

NOW THEREFORE the Board enacts as follows:

- 1. The Capital Bylaw of the Board for the 2025/26 Capital Plan as approved by the Minister, to include the supported capital project(s) specified in the letter addressed to the Secretary-Treasurer and Superintendent, dated *March 25, 2025*, is hereby adopted.
- 2. This Capital Bylaw may be cited as *School District No. 45 (West Vancouver)* Capital Bylaw No.2025/26 CPSD45-01.
