# **QUESTION & COMMENT PERIOD (10 Minutes)**

Spencer Capier, President of the WVTA emphasized the value of using 1701 data to educate its members on how systemic funding decisions are made and how these impact classroom supports. They noted that the process helps teachers better understand district priorities and constraints, recognizing that the leadership team consistently makes thoughtful use of available resources.



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**Spencer Capier** – The WVTA President also expressed concern about the slow pace of bargaining and the ongoing confusion between local and provincial language at the bargaining table. He encouraged Trustees to inquire about the reasons for the delays and to continue advocating for adequate funding to support inclusive education.

In response, the Board noted that the BCSTA Board of Directors have upcoming meetings in Victoria to advocate for increased funding to support students with inclusions. It was also acknowledged that the pace of bargaining may be influenced by ongoing developments with the BCGEU.
