Individual Photo Day	Students will have their individual photo taken on Monday, likely before lunch time. The photo company we use answers frequently asked questions <u>here</u> .	
Terry Fox Run	We have participated in the Terry Fox Run for more than 30 years and are hosting this year's run this Wednesday. Please encourage your child to wear red and white and bring a toonie if you can. We will have a short assembly at 11 AM and then run either around the Doonbuggy Trail or down to the Meadow depending on age and whether students have completed their e-Forms authorizing walking field trips.	
	We will recognize Orange Shirt Day on Thursday and all children, staff and families are encouraged to wear an orange shirt. This day, and the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, is to honour the legacy of indigenous, inuit and Metis children in Canada who were taken from their homes and sent to residential schools between the 1830s and 1980s.	
Orange Shirt Day	The motto of Orange Shirt Day is <i>Every Child Matters</i> . At BICS, students will create mini paper shirts to underscore this idea, filling in the phrase, "Every child matters because," creating a montage of shirts for display in the school, and participate in age-appropriate learning about inclusion and, for older students, Residential Schools. Later this week, families will receive a list of resources (videos, books, etc.) that can be viewed at home on National Day for Truth and Reconciliation on Friday.
