Did you know that there are two ways water gets into Grafton Lake? One is a spring, and the other is by run-off down the mountain.

Last week, some of our Grade 2-3 students took their learning outdoors to answer the question, "Where does our water at BICS come from?" We learned first-hand the way the water is treated and how different systems keep it clean and drinkable. We had a wonderful tour of the new system the municipality is creating to update the water services for the future. We then followed a trail back to school and found that the water from Grafton Lake appears in other places all along the path, even across
