Learning Highlight: Black History Month (Part 1)

Students across the grades have been engaging in learning about Black History in



Canada. Here is a sample. Inspired by this CBC Video, Ms. Adkin's class been learning about famous Black Canadians and Americans such as Viola Desmond, Michaelle Jean, Oscar Peterson, and the American Mathematician Mary Jackson. Ms. Van Schouwen's class has been learning about Ghanaian Kente Cloth and doing a related art project featuring some of the designs they have seen. Ms. Nicolson's class read the book, *Meet Willie O'Ree*, about a hockey player from New Brunswick, who was the first black player ever in the NHL. Students learned about how he overcame obstacles, faced racism, and had a severe

injury, but followed his dream and believed in himself.

Exposure to diversity and recognizing and celebrating people who have persevered despite huge obstacles continues to be important learning for students.
