

Treasurer report 2019-2020 FY Actual and 2020-2021 Budget for approval

MARISA YANG

- When we started off at Sep 2019, we had 45,922.89 in our retained earning. So we set our budget to have deficit of \$7000.
- This deficit budget enabled us to reduce our community fundraising goal to only \$10,000 for covering the on-going cost of wear-and-tear of our learning spaces and our iPads replacement plan.
- Also, we set up a committee to work with the Principal to come up a plan to take advantage of this reserve.

- In the Fall term and Winter term, we did well in all our fundraising activities i.e. movie night, bingo night, hot lunch. We also raised \$13,800 from our community fundraiser in Oct/Nov.
- Then, everything stopped in the Spring term due to Covid-19. We lost an expected income of approx. \$9800 from Hot Lunch. We had to cancel the Fundraising social event with silent auction in April with an expectation to raise \$6000 net.
- Most of the expense happened in the first 2 terms as per budget. In Jan, we proposed to spend extra \$20,445 from the reserve to purchase extra classroom furniture and equipment based on the recommendations from the school.

The followings are items we spent extra.

- \$577.5 for Saleema Noon motion carried in Oct 2019
- \$20,455 + \$3650 for Soundfield system, Water Station, Projector and extra furniture from Natural Pods - motion carried in Jan 2020. We actually didn't spend all. We had approx. \$4000 left.
- \$3200 for Division 16 set up motion carried in May 2019

- For 2019-2020 Full Year, we made a deficit of \$29,639.54. This figure included the extra expenses we approved during the year.
- The Balance Sheet shows we have \$16,283.5 carried forward into 2020-2021.
- Note: we have a bank balance more than the balance sheet indicates because we still have approx. \$28,000 Hot Lunch money from Spring Term.
- Overall, it was unfortunate that we lost the income from hot lunch and silent auction. We are blessed that we had reserve from the past to invest in some major fixtures.

2020-2021 Budget

- Aim to achieve a balance budget.
- No field trip is budgeted this is the single largest expense.
- Reduced teacher discretionary fund from \$500/division to \$350/division, total of \$5600
- STEAM and site licenses \$5500 the online learning website e.g. Mathletics
- Standard wear-and-tear of learning space \$5000
- Technology enhancement Google expedition and ongoing iPad replacements

2020-2021 Budget

Your support is vital!

- No hot lunch income is budget at this point this is the biggest fundraiser, usually contribute over \$22,000.
- Our other usual fundraising activities like Bingo Night, Movie Night seem not possible this year.
- We could support directly through our annual community fundraiser (aka cheque drive). This year target will be \$22,000.
- We rely on the success of this cheque drive initiative to get us through this year.
