We would like to say thank you for support and contributions so far. This school year has presented us with unprecedented challenges, and although this does not change our purpose, how we operate and fundraise is a bit different. Due to restrictions around the hot lunch program and social activities, this year's fundraising mainly relies on direct donations.

In order to continue supporting our school's iDEC program and high-quality teaching and learning, we need to raise **\$22,000**. We are happy to announce that we are halfway to our goal, with **\$13,540** raised so far! But we still have a long way to go.

To give all families a chance to participate in the campaign and improve our chances for success, we have decided to extend this community fundraiser until **November 22nd**. We now have 10 days left to reach or goal of \$22,000. We ask families to consider donating **\$100 per child**, but any amount is appreciated.

December's Whole-School Inquiry on Empathy



This year's Whole School Inquiry, which begins on Monday, November 30th, will be focusing on the question, **Why is it important to meet the needs of those who need help in society, and how can we use empathy to help us do this?** This year we will be anchoring our Inquiry in the research of John Tyler-Binfet, Associate Professor, Okanagan School of Education at the University of British Columbia. He has completed a variety of research based on kindness and its effects in schools. Professor Tyler-Binfet classifies kindness into 3 categories: **Giving, Helping** and **Caring.** He will be joining the Caulfeild staff virtually next week to share his findings in more detail, and to assist in guiding our Whole-School Inquiry based on his research. We are very excited to learn more from Professor Tyler-Binfet which will deepen our Whole-School Inquiry even further.

The community event which will kick-off our Whole-School Inquiry on Empathy, our Read-A-Thon, is fast approaching on Tuesday, December 1st. This event will be our main fund-raising effort that will provide us with the means to reach out to various community agencies and provide assistance. We understand that all families have different circumstances, therefore we are asking that families support in a way that is feasible for them. More information will be coming soon.

During these extraordinary times Caulfeild School would like to challenge all families to explore the idea of Empathy at home and think about how your family can help those in need in our community. How can your family help others this holiday season? How can your family show kindness to others? As outlined by John Tyler-Binfet, this could be in the form of giving, but can also be displayed in non-monetary ways such as helping and caring. Now, more than ever, it is important that we come together and support each other as a community.




