Empathy Inquiry Read-a-thon Donations

Whole-School Empathy Inquiry Big Idea:

Why is it important to meet the needs of those who need help in society, and how can we use empathy to help us do this?



Our Empathy Inquiry Read-a-thon is fast approaching and we are asking that forms and donations be returned to school tomorrow, Friday, November 28th. The Read-a-thon will be a collaborative fund-raising effort that will provide classes with the means to reach out to various community agencies and provide assistance as a way to demonstrate kindness and empathy toward others. Students will be asked to read for 1-2 hours at school on the afternoon of Tuesday, December 1st as a way to show their support.

The collected donations will go to a charitable organization of each grade's choice. Each grade group will investigate and research local charities and decide, as a group, where they would like to donate their raised funds. In the past, we have supported agencies such as the Harvest Project, Santa for Seniors, the Christmas Bureau, Family Services of the North Shore Christmas Bureau, and Backpack Buddies. This is a wonderful opportunity for our students to recognize the importance of supporting others in their community, especially during these unusual times.

Grade 1 Inquiry



Both Grade 1 classes have just completed their inquiry into the Zones of Regulation. They have been investigating the question, How does understanding our emotions impact how we interact with others? Students began this inquiry by exploring who they are, and the various emotions that they feel. They classified these emotions into the Zones of Regulation; Blue, Green, Yellow and Red. They then analyzed the size of problems, as with a deeper understanding of the size of the problem, the corresponding emotion can be better matched. The Grade 1s also explored a variety of calming strategies in order that they can move their emotions into the Green Zone and be ready to learn. Students explored techniques such as breathing exercises, yoga, meditation, counting to 10, forest bathing, jumping jacks, and getting a drink of water to name a few. See below for some of the Grade

Hot Lunch Parent Volunteers Needed

We are happy to announce that we have been given the green light to bring back the Hot Lunch program for two days a week! The plan is to open sales upon our return from the holidays and restart the program late January. Hot Lunch would be offered on *Tuesdays* and *Fridays* with Well-Fed and Panago pizza respectively as vendors.

In order to be able to run the program we need a small team of <u>very</u> dedicated volunteers. We can have only one volunteer in the building per day, so we are looking for one parent that can commit to Tuesdays, another for Fridays and a third person who can fill-in for the other two volunteers in case they cannot be present. The volunteers would need to be trained on school safety protocols and consistently be available between 12:00-1:20 pm on their respective day.

The volunteers would take pre-sorted bags with lunches to the classrooms, stay on site for the duration of the lunch to make sure that everyone gets their order, and collect empty bags at the end. CPAC Constitution and Bylaws Review

The School Act requires every PAC to have bylaws. Bylaws are the fundamental rules that define the PAC - essentially a contract between the members defining their rights and duties. Bylaws are meant to be changeable and should be reviewed every few years.

The CPAC bylaws were last updated in 2016. As such, we undertook to review our Constitution and Bylaws and have recommended some changes. Under the 'CPAC Resources' on our <u>website</u>.
