
Learning at iDEC

iDEC's Local Initiative Club - A Special Empathy Update

As shared last week, we received numerous donations for North Shore Women's Centre exceeding our expectations. Here is a final update we are proud to include this week.

Way to go Caulfeild, we beat our donation goal of 360 items by a lot! As a school community we collected a total of 861 items that will go towards helping single moms and their families on the North Shore. The Division who brought in the most donations and have earned a prize for their entire class is Division 9 with 141 donations. Procedure for Late Arrivals and Early Pick-Up

Though we strongly encourage students to arrive and leave school during their scheduled times, we understand that there are occasionally extenuating circumstances that cannot be helped. When that is the case please email Ms. Chung <u>jchung@wvschools.ca</u> and follow the guidelines below:

Late Arrivals: Students needing to arrive late are asked to come at the end of one of the two outdoor recess breaks. They are to check in at the office then enter with their class.

Kindergarten to Grade 3: 10:30 am or 12:40 pm Grades 4 to 7: 10:30 am or 1:00 pm

Early Pick-Ups: Students needing to leave early are asked to leave at the beginning of one of the two outdoor recess breaks. They are to check out at the office, then exit through the main doors to be picked up at the top of the roundabout.

Kindergarten to Grade 3: 10:10 am or 12:00 pm Grades 4 to 7: 10:10 am or 12:40 pm

We thank you for your cooperation in following these procedures as they help minimize classroom disruption, as well as, ensure that health & safety protocols are followed as students enter and leave the school.

Environmental Action Committee

Did you know? that plastic-coated paper containers mostly used as takeout containers do not go in your compost bin? Studies have shown, these paper products take an extended period to biodegrade especially when both sides are plastic coated (<u>ecoplastic.org</u>). The plastic covering eventually breaks apart and microparticles of plastic result. This means the microplastics will end up in the compostable soil as fragments drain into our water and eventually be consumed by soil, freshwater and ocean feeders. The feeders will be consumed through every part of the food chain and eventually end up in the food we eat.

What can we do? to reduce our impact?

If you get a paper takeout container, do the grease test. If the grease goes through, it's safe for the green bin. If it doesn't go through, it most likely has a plastic liner. Do not throw plastic covered paper in the green bin. Rinse it and put it in your paper recycling bin (recycle bc.ca).
