
Learning at iDEC

Admissions 2022-23

Kindergarten Registration

Over the past three years we have received enough registrations to plan and staff for two kindergarten classes. For 2022-23 we hope to do the same, but are lower on our registrations for Kindergarten than expected at this time. In the event you know a family with a child who is ready to register for K (born 2017) and is not yet registered, please share the admission information links above.

Performing a Daily Health Check: Families should continue to perform the Daily Health Check daily health check with your child(ren) prior to drop off each morning. If your child is not feeling well, please do not send them to school. VCH recommends that you can also use the K-12 health-checker app.

Thank you Caulfeild families for your commitment to mask safety measures. We would ask that families continue to help their child come prepared with their own mask, and an extra each day.

Procedure for Late Arrivals and Early Pick-Up

Though we strongly encourage students to arrive and leave school during their scheduled times, we understand that there are occasionally extenuating circumstances that cannot be helped. When that is the case please email Ms. Chung ichung@wvschools.ca and follow the guidelines below:

Late Arrivals: Students needing to arrive late are asked to come at the end of one of the two outdoor recess breaks. They are to check in at the office then enter with their class.

Kindergarten to Grade 3: 10:30 am or 12:40 pm Grades 4 to 7: 10:30 am or 1:00 pm

Early Pick-Ups: Students needing to leave early are asked to leave at the beginning of one of the two outdoor recess breaks. They are to check out at the office, then exit through the main doors to be picked up at the top of the roundabout.

Kindergarten to Grade 3: 10:10 am or 12:00 pm Grades 4 to 7: 10:10 am or 12:40 pm

We thank you for your cooperation in following these procedures as they help minimize classroom disruption, as well as, ensure that health & safety protocols are followed as students enter and leave the school.

Did you know, global paper use has increased 400% since the 1970s (https://www.greenamerica.org). This vast increase has been at the mercy of our environment. The pulp and paper industry is the 5th largest consumer of energy, accounting for 4% of the world energy use. In the previous E-bulletin, we brought your attention to the overuse of paper towels. Interestingly, it is cardboard and packaging paper that comprise the majority of global paper consumption. This high consumption of packaging paper materials is directly related to an increase in online purchasing (tonerbuzz.com/facts-about-paper/).

So what can we do to lessen our environmental impact when it comes to paper?

Green: Reuse or recycle all the paper you use.

Greener: Reduce your paper consumption by minimizing your online shopping and be conscientious about the packaging and the shipping of the goods you purchase.

Greenest: Buy only from the companies that use responsible packaging, buy goods in bulk and use your containers, and live by the mantra "less is more".
