Learning at iDEC

Welcome Back!

It is great to have our students and staff back together after a well-deserved Spring Break. The sun has been out, new inquiries are underway and a positive energy is felt throughout the school. We have some great things to share about our learning already and so much more in store for this final term ahead.

We are grateful for the beautiful building and grounds that we have here at Caulfeild. We are also very fortunate to have such a dedicated custodial team who make our learning spaces look spectacular. Mr. Randy, Mr. Alcantara and Mr. Duque have Caulfeild looking its best and ready for our final term of the year.

Our Whole School Inquiry

Caulfeild iDEC is officially underway with our second whole school inquiry unit of the year. On Wednesday we launched our learning with a provocation with our buddy classes and the Caulfeild Bear in The Den. From there, students have, and will continue to, participate in other group, partner and individual learning opportunities to begin their inquiry cycle (the 6 D's).

Our whole school inquiry is a chance for all staff and students to work together on a common challenge that connects to our Bear Traits and an inquiry each grade is already doing. The past two days have been an excellent example of how working together with the Bear Traits helps everyone feel connected and ready to go deeper with their learning.

Here is our essential question:

How have the Bear Traits helped individuals you have discovered in your current inquiry make positive contributions in their field?



Get Caught Being the Bear

This week we have launched a new campaign called Get Caught Being the Bear. It is a way to highlight, recognize and celebrate our values with students and staff as we embark on our next whole school inquiry that focuses on the Bear Traits.



Here's how it works:

- All staff have Caught Being the Bear tickets. 1.
- 2. Students and staff are awarded a Caught Being the Bear ticket for their actions that demonstrate Being the Bear.
- Staff give students, or fellow staff members Being the Bear tickets to recognize their positive 3. choices.
- 4. Students can also recommend a Caught Being the Bear ticket for another student and have it awarded together with a staff member.
- 5. Draw boxes are outside the office for students and staff to submit their tickets as they receive them. There is a PRIMARY, INTERMEDIATE and STAFF box.
- 6. The last Wednesday of April, May and June are Pink Shirt Day and Caught Being the Bear draw days. This will be a special day for us to recognize all the kindness we see across our school and give away some fun prizes to some lucky draw winners.

Health and Safety Highlights for Term 3

Health and safety protocols continue to evolve across the province. We will continue to encourage our families to keep their children home when they are sick - doing so, helps to keep other learners, staff, and other families in our community healthy.

There are some protocols that we will continue to keep in place as they are very helpful and benefit all our learning community members. The procedures for late arrivals and early pick-up as seen below is an example of a routine we will keep in place moving forward.

If you will be visiting your child's teacher, appointments are still appreciated. We would also ask that you please sign-in in at the main entrance beside the office when you visit inside the school.

Performing a Daily Health Check: Families should continue to perform the daily health check with your child(ren) prior to drop off each morning. If your child is not feeling well, please do not send them to school. The <u>BC Self-Assessment Tool</u> or <u>When to get tested</u> page are the most up to date resources to determine if you need testing.

Our work in the office is well underway to prepare for September and the 2022-2023 school year. Procedure for Late Arrivals and Early Pick-Up

Though we strongly encourage students to arrive and leave school during their scheduled times, we understand that there are occasionally extenuating circumstances that cannot be helped. When that is the case please email Ms. Chung <u>ichung@wvschools.ca</u> and follow the guidelines below:

Late Arrivals: Students needing to arrive late are asked to come at the end of one of the two outdoor recess breaks. They are to check in at the office then enter with their class.

Kindergarten to Grade 3: 10:30 am or 12:40 pm Grades 4 to 7: 10:30 am or 1:00 pm

Early Pick-Ups: Students needing to leave early are asked to leave at the beginning of one of the two outdoor recess breaks. They are to check out at the office, then exit through the main doors to be picked up at the top of the roundabout.
