Throughout our school community, this goal is already becoming something that supports our planning, decision making and focus across our Inquiry and Digitally Enhanced Community (iDEC).

Not Returning Next Year?

Our work in the office is well underway to prepare for September and the 2022-2023 school year. After School Playground and Student Safety

Spring is here and the days are brighter and longer. With the sunny weather we begin to see an increase in students wanting to stay and play on the playground after school. We do ask families to remember we do not have supervision on the playground after school. At dismissal, students should go home if they are not supervised by a parent/guardian. The playground is not closed and students are welcome to play when they have supervision. A good routine for families to follow is, have your child return home from school first and then return to play once you have made a plan for after school.

Health and Safety Information - Staying Well

Health and safety protocols continue to evolve across the province. Our school continues to encourage our families to keep their children home when they are sick – doing so, helps to keep other learners, staff, and families in our community healthy. Colds, flus and Covid continue to be illnesses that we all need to be mindful of and keeping from spreading in our school community.

In person meetings and events/gatherings are growing all the time here at iDEC. If you are visiting your child's teacher, appointments are still appreciated. We ask that you please sign-in in at the main entrance beside the office and then check in with one of our office staff to announce your arrival when you visit inside the school for your arranged appointment.

Performing a Daily Health Check: Families should continue to perform the <u>daily health check</u> with your child(ren) prior to drop off each morning. If your child is not feeling well, please do not send them to school. The <u>BC Self-Assessment Tool</u> or <u>When to get tested</u> page are the most up to date resources to determine if you need testing.

Our Procedure for Late Arrivals and Early Pick-Up

Though we strongly encourage students to arrive and leave school during their scheduled times, we understand that there are occasionally extenuating circumstances that cannot be helped. When that is the case please email Ms. Chung <u>ichung@wvschools.ca</u> and follow the guidelines below. Please also keep in mind that the staff at iDEC want all our learners in K to 7 to have the best possible start to their school day. We ask families to ensure that their children are arriving to school on time. Schedules and routines are extremely important to a child's development and academic achievement as key concepts and lessons begin at the start of our school day.

Late Arrivals: Students needing to arrive late are asked to come at the end of one of the two outdoor recess breaks. They are to check in at the office then enter with their class.

Kindergarten to Grade 3: 10:30 am or 12:40 pmGrades 4 to 7: 10:30 am or 1:00 pm

Early Pick-Ups: Students needing to leave early are asked to leave at the beginning of one of the two outdoor recess breaks. They are to check out at the office, then exit through the main doors to be picked up at the top of the roundabout.

Kindergarten to Grade 3: 10:10 am or 12:00 pm

Grades 4 to 7: 10:10 am or 12:40 pm

Environment Action Committee

Did you know the biggest energy consumption in our homes is from heating and air conditioning. What can we do to make our homes more energy efficient in cold temperatures? 1.Draft proof - Drafts waste 5-30% of energy. Seal leaks around doors and windows. 2.Insulate windows - with heavy curtains or insulation film 3. Reverse ceiling fans- clockwise pushes down warm air from the ceiling 4. Change furnace filters- dirty filters restrict airflow so the furnace has to work harder and use more energy (in cold weather filters should be changed every 3 months) 5.Turn your thermostat down- every 1 degree it's turned down will lower your energy bill 1.5-5% 6. Heat the person not the room- wear sweaters, slippers and scarves to keep you warm
