**Learning at iDEC**

Hello Caulfeild iDEC Families,

Last week I shared a little about what the "iDEC" in our name means to Caulfeild students, teachers and families. Today I want to share a little bit more about our Inquiry based Digitally Enhanced Community. Design Thinking is a key component of our Inquiry learning here at Caulfeild. Our cycle of Inquiry has six stages: *Define, Discover, Dream, Design, Deliver and Debrief*. This language for discovery and learning ensures that students across grade levels have a shared understanding of Inquiry based learning, and continue to develop these skills as they grow and learn. Topics for Inquiry learning is also shared across the school on our Learning Wall, found in the front foyer. I hope you take the opportunity to check it out tonight (Thursday, September 22nd) at our Welcome Back Open House and BBQ!

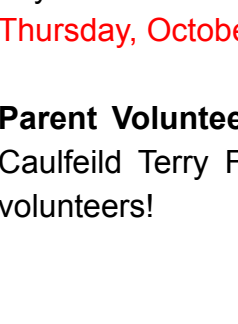

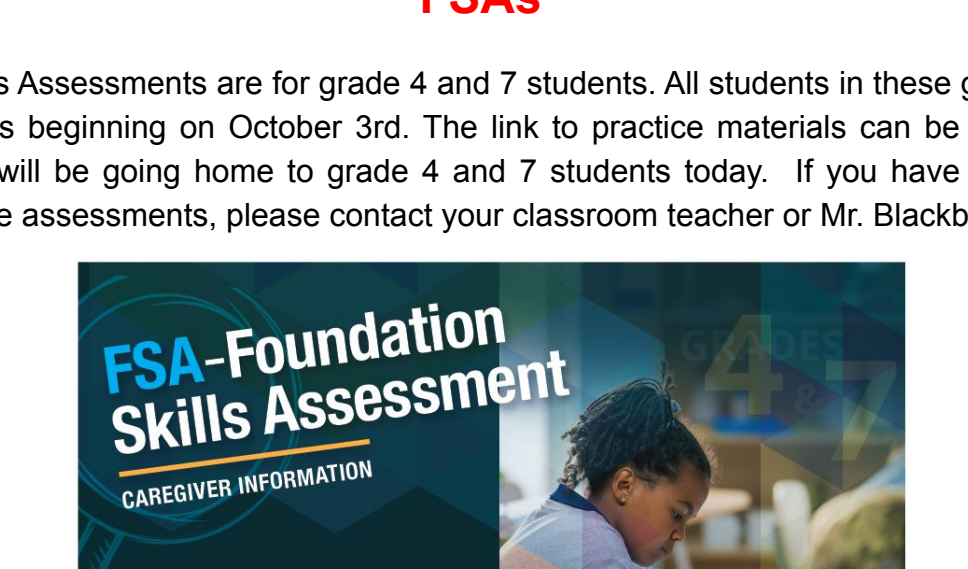
**Schedule of Meets at Ambleside:**

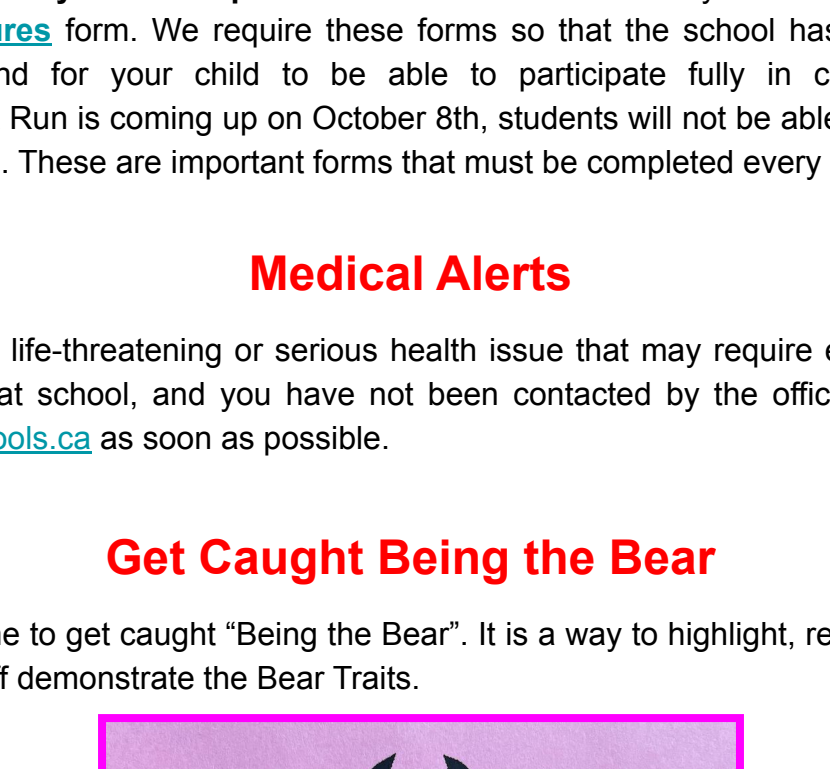

**School Forms - Now PAST DUE**

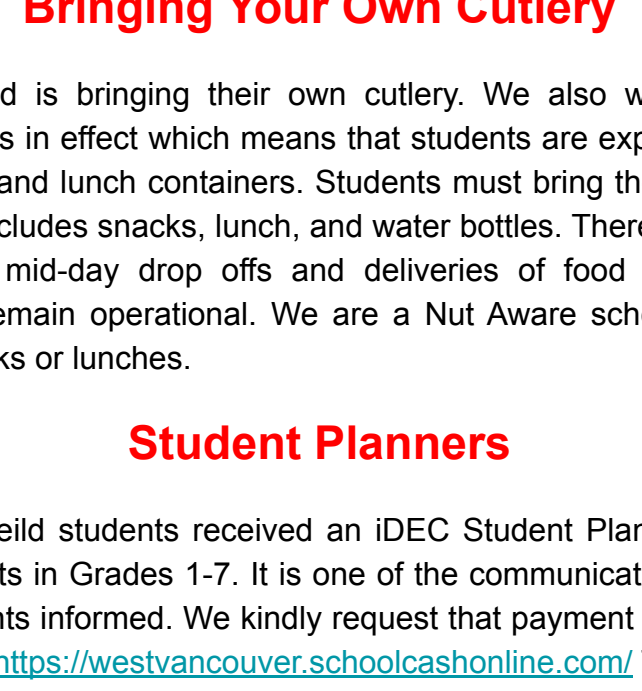
**A reminder to complete the online Policies & Procedures form and return the paper forms as soon as possible as they are now past due.** To date we have only received **41%** of the online [Policies and Procedures](#) form. We require these forms so that the school has the most up to date contact information and for your child to be able to participate fully in classroom and school activities. The Terry Fox Run is coming up on October 8th, students will not be able to participate without a completed P&P Form. These are important forms that must be completed every year for each student.

**Get Caught Being the Bear**

We encourage everyone to get caught "Being the Bear". It is a way to highlight, recognize and celebrate when students and staff demonstrate the Bear Traits.



Here's how it works:

1. All staff have Caught Being the Bear tickets.
2. Students and staff are awarded a Caught Being the Bear ticket for their actions that demonstrate Being the Bear.
3. Staff give students, or fellow staff members Being the Bear tickets to recognize their positive choices.
4. Students can also recommend a Caught Being the Bear ticket for another student and have it awarded together with a staff member.
5. Draw boxes are outside the office for students and staff to submit their tickets as they receive them. There is a PRIMARY, INTERMEDIATE and STAFF box.
6. The **last Wednesday** of every month are **Pink Shirt Day** and **Caught Being the Bear draw days**. This will be a special day for us to recognize all the kindness we see across our school and give away some fun prizes to some lucky draw winners. Next Wednesday, September 28th will be Red and White Day for our Terry Fox Run so we will only have a Caught Being the Bear draw and resume the Pink Shirt Day on Wednesday, October 26th.

**Dress for the Fall Weather**

Fall is here and so is the rain (sometimes)! All recess periods will be outside regardless of the weather unless extreme conditions make outdoor play unsafe. Please ensure you send your children to school equipped for outdoor play. With the amazing playgrounds and outdoor spaces we have at iDEC, embracing the natural world is an expectation. Outdoor recreation periods are an important part of a child's physical activity and social time. Please send your children to school equipped with raincoats, hats and boots for rainy days.

**Bringing Your Own Cutlery**

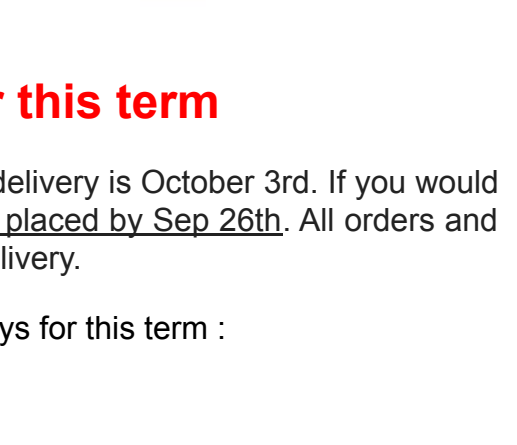
Please make sure your child is bringing their own cutlery. We also want to remind you that the "pack-it-in/pack-it-out" policy is in effect which means that students are expected to pack out their lunch waste, such as leftover food and lunch containers. Students must bring their own food and drink at the start of the school day; this includes snacks, lunch, and water bottles. There will be no sharing of food or drink and there will be no mid-day drop offs and deliveries of food items (or any other items). Water-bottle filling stations remain operational. We are a Nut Aware school. Please do not send nut based foods in students snacks or lunches.

**Student Planners**

Last week most of the Caulfeild students received an iDEC Student Planner. Student Planners are a required supply for all students in Grades 1-7. It is one of the communication tools that is used to keep students organized and parents informed. **CPAC 1st General Meeting**

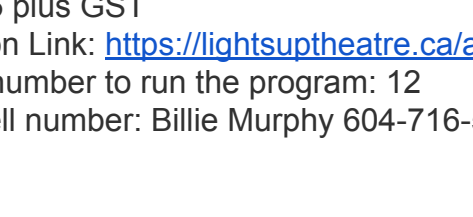
