

To date we have received 96% of the online Policies and Procedures form. We require these forms so that the school has the most up to date contact information and consent for your child to be able to participate fully in classroom and school activities.

Our Procedure for Late Arrivals and Early Pick-Up Though we strongly encourage students to arrive and leave school during their scheduled times, we understand that there are occasionally extenuating circumstances that cannot be helped. When that is the case please email Ms. Chung <u>ichung@wvschools.ca</u> and follow the guidelines below. Please also keep in mind that the staff at iDEC want all our learners in K to 7 to have the best possible start to their school day. We ask families to ensure that their children are arriving to school on time. Schedules and routines are extremely important to a child's development and academic achievement as key concepts and lessons begin at the start of our school day. Late Arrivals: Students needing to arrive late are asked to come at the end of one of the two outdoor recess breaks at 10:30 am or 12:50 pm. They are to check in at the office then enter with their class. Early Pick-Ups: Students needing to leave early are asked to leave at the beginning of one of the two outdoor recess breaks at 10:10 am or 12:10 pm. They are to check out at the office, then exit through




