CPAC Annual Community Fundraising Campaign

CPAC Annual Community Fundraiser is ON. This fundraiser along with our Hot Lunch Program are CPAC's largest fund contributors. Such community fundraisers are a popular avenue of fundraising for schools around the province as they require minimum time commitment from parents and allow parents' make a direct impact on their children's learning.

Thanks to our amazing school community, we have always been able to hit our targeted goals and support our children's school experiences. With the funds raised last year we were able to support our students' learning by purchasing 20 iPADs, 3 soundfield systems, and educational site licenses; funding field trips and special educational and sports programs (i.e. Elevate, Badminton with an Olympian, Saleema Noon); help teachers acquire teaching materials and supplies; as well as organize community events (e.g. Bingo Night, Pumpkin Patch, Lunar New Year Celebration, etc). You can find more detailed information on how the funds were raised and spent in 2021-2022 here.

This year the Community fundraiser happens on November 1-15. We aim to raise \$20,000. 100% of the raised funds will go towards CPAC projects that support Caulfeild iDEC program and enrich our students' learning experiences, such as:

- Technology acquisitions and replacements (iPADs and chromebooks);
- Learning spaces updates;
- Class field trips;
- Teaching materials and Site licenses:
- Additional educational, arts, and sports programs.

We suggest a donation of **\$100 per child**, however any contribution is greatly appreciated. Student and Family Affordability Fund

The Ministry of Education has provided West Vancouver Schools \$650,000, a one-time funding for us to make the 22/23 school year more affordable for students and families in need. We have now received the funding for our 18 schools and have allocated the money based on the specific needs of each of our school communities. Our allocation:

- Will allow schools to cover costs for school fees, school supplies or other school related costs for students in need
- Some funds will be used to benefit large groups of both elementary and secondary students

Remembrance Day

Over the past several years, we have grown as a school, which means that with all students and staff in attendance will have about 40 seats available for the first people to line up by the K/Grade 3 entrance at 10:30 on November 10th. While I wish we could invite each iDEC family to our event, we will reach full capacity in our Den with these numbers. We are looking forward to the Assembly that will be led by Grade 7 students and will include our Band, student presentations, and artwork.

Extra Halloween Candy

Once again this year at iDEC you will be able to donate your extra candy until **November 15th**. We will use these donations for future projects to give back to our community. These types of learning opportunities will emerge in the December whole school inquiry that will focus on being an inclusive community. We would also like to ask that students continue to bring healthy snacks to school to fuel their body for learning. This not only helps fuel our learners with nutritiously, but ensures wrapper are properly recycled at home.



Admissions 2023-24

Admissions for ALL Kindergarten registrations (in-catchment, out of catchment and out of district) and for IN-CATCHMENT registrations in Grades 1-12 will be open on Monday, October 17th. Please note that current Caulfeild students are not required to re-apply for the subsequent school year.

Registration for High School

If your first choice high school is **Rockridge**, you are not required to complete an online application (regardless of where you live). Rockridge counsellors will be visiting schools in late winter/early spring and distributing transfer forms at that time.

HOWEVER, if your first choice for secondary school is somewhere other than Rockridge, you must complete an online application according to the student registration timelines. Please note: No out of catchment or out of district applications for secondary are accepted until January.

October 17, 2022 - All Kindergarten applicants (catchment, district and out of district) and all students residing in catchment for entry into Grades 1-12.

January 16, 2023 - Out of catchment (in-district) and Out of District applicants may apply online for Grades 1 - 12.

Fall Weather and Labels

This is the time of year when all students should bring a coat to school everyday so they are prepared for cold and wet weather. We wish to thank you for helping prepare your child for our outdoor times each day. Please label your child's clothing to help reunite items with their owner.

Bringing Your Own Cutlery

Please make sure your child is bringing their own cutlery. We also want to remind you that the "pack-it-in/pack-it-out" policy is in effect which means that students are expected to pack out their lunch waste, such as leftover food and lunch containers. Students must bring their own food and drink at the start of the school day; this includes snacks, lunch, and water bottles. There will be no sharing of food or drink and there will be no mid-day drop offs and deliveries of food items (or any other items). Water-bottle filling stations remain operational. We are a Nut Aware school. Please do not send nut based foods in students snacks or lunches.

MyEd Family and Student Portal

MyEducation BC has developed a new feature that provides BC students and parents with the choice to connect their BC services card to MyEducation BC and use the BC services card app, rather than the district issued username and password.

Our Procedure for Late Arrivals and Early Pick-Up

Though we strongly encourage students to arrive and leave school during their scheduled times, we understand that there are occasionally extenuating circumstances that cannot be helped. When that is the case please email Ms. Chung jchung@wvschools.ca and follow the guidelines below. Please also keep in mind that the staff at iDEC want all our learners in K to 7 to have the best possible start to their school day. We ask families to ensure that their children are arriving to school on time. Schedules and routines are extremely important to a child's development and academic achievement as key concepts and lessons begin at the start of our school day.

Late Arrivals: Students needing to arrive late are asked to come at the end of one of the two outdoor recess breaks at 10:30 am or 12:50 pm. They are to check in at the office then enter with their class.

Early Pick-Ups: Students needing to leave early are asked to leave at the beginning of one of the two outdoor recess breaks at 10:10 am or 12:10 pm. They are to check out at the office, then exit through the main doors to be picked up at the top of the roundabout.

We thank you for your cooperation in following these procedures as they help minimize classroom disruption.

Lost and Found

If your child is missing something, please ask them to check the lost and found table set up outside of the Gym. We have included a picture of our lost and found here this week to help reunite lost items with their owners. Items not picked up by November 4 will be donated to a community organization as we do not have space to store old clothing items.



Accessible Parking

There are two signs along Caulfeild Dr. that indicate the drivers need to save space for accessible parking. This is especially important during drop off and pick up. If someone is not parked in the accessible parking spot, this does not mean that it is available to families who do not require access. We have a number of families that do require accessible parking, they have been identified by the school, and these spots are reserved for them. Thank you for understanding.

Drop off and pick up is going well, but we do need to share a few reminders. First, please refrain from parking in teacher spots, even temporarily, during this time. We also cannot be in the habit of parking or stopping our cars in the roundabout. The roundabout should always be moving. If you need to park for any reason, you will need to find parent (west side of lot) or street parking.
