**Cyber Safety Cot'd (Grades 4 and 7)** - Conversations have continued with intermediate divisions. The WVPD liaison officers spoke with grades 4 and 7 this month, and Cari Wilson is offering virtual sessions with all classrooms over the next few months. Our intermediate classrooms will be signing up.

**Lockdown Drill** - Successful Lockdown Drill on Thursday. Teachers prepare students at a grade-appropriate level about how to lockdown in an emergency situation.
