- 1) If you are meeting your child on the school grounds (and not picking them up by car), please talk to your child and set a designated spot for your child to meet you. This way your child will consistently know where to look to see if you are there.
- 2) Please stay in the area behind the large rock, and do not enter the area designated for classes to line up and be dismissed. The more bodies there are in the area, the more disorganized dismissal becomes.

Thank you in advance for your support and cooperation in this matter. Returning your child to you quickly and safely is of utmost importance to us.

Decriminalization and Substance Use

Taiking to Children and Youth about Decriminalization and Substance Use: Resources for Parents/Guardians and Caregivers January 31, 2023 Beckground: As you may be aware, Health Canada has granted the Province of British Columbia an exemption from the federal Controlled Drugs and Substances Art, allowing the removal of criminal penalities for possission of small amounts of certain Illics Justitances for personal use. Decriminalizing people who use drugs is a part of the Government's work to tackle the toxic drug crisis, intended to remove the shame and sigma associated with substance use and support people in accessing important health and social services. To be clear this exemption does not epspl be licenced child care or & X-32 achold properties. The federal doctmorial penalities for possission of liegal substances, regardless of amount, while on child care and or X-32 achol properties.	istr	y of Education and Child Care
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It is important to note that decriminalizing people who use illicit substances does not mean legalizing drugs. This is not the same as legalizing cannabis as the federal government did; decriminalized drugs will not be sold in stores and they are not legal to manufacture. Drug trafficting and similar drug-relat diffences involving lingal substances in any amount will remain illegal.

oving the shame and stigma associated with substance use is one tool of many in British Columbia's onse to the toxic drug crisis as laid out in <u>A Pathway to Hope</u>, the Government's roadmap for ling a supports and services for mental health and addictions care.

This plan also guides the creation and expansion of substance use services for British Columbians – including doubling the number of youth treatment beds – nanging from prevention and early intervention to intensive treatment and crisis intervention. Prevention efforts include the opening of 14 foundry contres scress the province, which provide wraparound mental health and substance use support to young people.

Talking to Young People: While decriminalization will not apply to youth aged 17 and younger, this important change could provide an opportunity to talk openly with your child or youth about substance use and addictions.

The Ministry of Education and Child Care's <u>Logest Bespect and A Safe Education (erase) substance use website abo provides subdems, parenta/guardiana, caring adults and educators with information and resources to support conversations with yourh about substances.
