Today we were visited by Cst. Nikolai and Cst. Lee with the West Vancouver Police Department. The team shared some information with Grade 5, 6, and 7 students about Cyber Safety. The conversation is a continuation of one that happens in all classes, at an age appropriate level. Our police liaison officers explain the concept of "Digital Citizenship", they review how to stay safe online, why sharing personal information can be dangerous, and what to do if you encounter a situation online that is concerning. This is only the first presentation of this sort that intermediate students will have this year, as other opportunities will be available in the spring term. As with all matters of safety, families are our partners in this conversation. # According to Public Safety Canada, three out of ten Canadian youths have experienced Cyberbullying;


"Parents are a vital part of the equation when it comes to raising responsible digital citizens. Educate yourself about your child's digital life - it is likely to be very different from what you experiences as a child. Keep the lines of communication open with your child, other parents and your child's school. Remember, it takes a village to raise a child!" - Cari Wilson, District Innovation and Technology Lead

"Cyberbullying hurts, and can have a negative impact on the self-esteem, relationships, and future lives of those involved." As our Police Liaison Officer, Cst. Nikolai shared the dangers of such behaviour with divisions 6 - 1 this week, and the topic continues to be an important part of the learning in all classrooms, I am hopeful that students have learned about the risks of acting in an unsafe manner online, and what to do if they come across it. However, because this behaviour can have damaging effects on both the victim and perpetrator, I want to share some resources with all of our families.
