## Learning at iDEC

## What is iDEC

One of the first questions new families ask me, is "What is iDEC"? At Caulfeild Elementary, **iDEC** stands for *Inquiry-based Digitally Enhanced Community*. It is the foundation of our teaching and learning, designed to embed the BC Curriculum through inquiry and design thinking while developing the Core Competencies—communication, creative and critical thinking, personal and social responsibility, and cultural awareness.

Learning at iDEC is continuous and connected. Our *Program of Inquiry* builds inquiry skills from Kindergarten through Grade 7, with teachers collaborating on units that are meaningful, relevant, and engaging. Students are encouraged to ask questions, explore deeply, and reflect on their learning.

Digital tools play a key role. With school iPads in the primary grades and laptops in the intermediate years, students use platforms like Google Classroom, ViewBoards and other apps to support literacy, numeracy, and inquiry projects. The goal is to help learners shift from being consumers of technology to becoming thoughtful and ethical creators.

Our spaces are also designed with learning in mind. Classrooms include a variety of micro-environments that allow students to choose where they learn best. Natural, calming materials are used to create welcoming and purposeful spaces.

Each Wednesday, students are dismissed at 2:00 for home-based independent learning, our "Wednesday Wonders" giving teachers valuable time to collaborate and plan. This ensures a consistent, thoughtful approach to inquiry across the school.

iDEC is more than a program—it's a way of preparing students to thrive in a changing world.

## Cross Country and Athletic Fees

Our Cross-Country season has begun! Thanks to coaches Mrs. Lapinskie, Ms. Hamill and Ms. Prins. Meets are held at Ambleside on Tuesday September 16, 23, and Oct 7st. Parents are responsible for arranging transportation to and from the meets. They end promptly at 5:00, though some races will occur earlier, so arriving early is suggested. The order for races is typically; Grade 7, 3, 4, 5, 6. Children do not have to remain at the Meet after their run and can leave before 5:00 if they sign out with a teacher. Remember to wear Bear Wear or a Red T-shirt to the meet!

Practices will be held on Monday and Thursday mornings at 8:00.

WVECA Athletic Fees - Due to the increasing cost of fees associated with running our Elementary Athletics programs in all West Vancouver schools, the WVECA will be charging \$10 per student per sport for the 2025-2026 school year for all students who sign up. Payments will be made through School Cash Online which has been set up for each school through the District. If your child is not participating in district sports, you will not incur this charge.

## Personal Digital Devices in Schools

On January 26th, 2024, the Province announced three significant actions to enhance the safety and well-being of students in relation to digital technology, including the introduction of restrictions on the use of personal digital devices in schools (this would apply to cell phones, laptops, tablets, smartwatches, etc.). These updated policies will continue to be in place for the 25-26 school year.

Elementary Schools: Personal digital device expectations will be in effect throughout the full school day, including before school, after school, and during break times.

In September, we will ask parents and guardians to support these guidelines by minimizing calls and texts to their children during school hours. It is important for students to remain focused and engaged in their learning without the expectation of responding immediately to messages. We also encourage families to start thinking about how they can support these new expectations to ensure a smooth transition for everyone.

Thank you for your attention and cooperation as we work together to create a safe and productive learning environment for our students.

## Tennis Court Renewal

The District of West Vancouver is currently working on a renewal project on the tennis and basketball courts located in our Lower Forest. During this project, students will not have access to parts of the the Lower Forest or the courts. Fencing has been installed to secure the area. While this will be a lengthy process, the completed upgrades will provide lasting benefits for Caulfeild iDEC students and the community.

## Pick Up and Drop Off: Important Reminders

All students in K-7 will be dismissed at 2:30 pm, except on **Wednesdays when we dismiss at 2:00**. For orderly and quick dismissal, please park using the street parking and walk to the designated pick-up space near the top of the roundabout. With all students dismissed together, driving through the roundabout should only be used by families who absolutely need to remain in the car, with priority for primary students, as we expect lineups to be busy and long. If your child is not ready (outside and waiting), we may need to move you along and out of the line in order to keep traffic moving.

- Please DO NOT stop for pick up and drop off at the north side crosswalk on Caulfeild Drive. This is a no stopping zone because stopping puts students in dangerous situations. There are places to stop preceding and following the crosswalk. Check for signage. WVPD will support periodic enforcement of this area.

- Grade 6/7 Pickup (Drivers): Please use parking spaces along Caulfeild Drive so your child can safely enter your vehicle. Do not stop on Caulfeild Drive unless there is a parking space available. Please reserve at least two parking spaces near the front for students and families with accessibility needs.

## Daily Health Checks



Parents are asked to do daily health checks before sending children to school. We ask for your assistance to ensure that your child is healthy and well enough to participate in normal school activities. If your child is unwell, please report their absence through the school email at [caulfeild@wvschools.ca](mailto:caulfeild@wvschools.ca). Parents are also reminded that communicable diseases should be reported to your classroom teacher and to the school office. This would include chicken pox, measles, etc. While not a communicable disease, we also ask that students and families report any cases of lice to the office.

When we have a report, we can take some preventative measures within our community and classrooms.

## Optional Accident Insurance for Families

West Vancouver Schools reminds families each year that personal injury or accident costs are not covered by the district or its insurance provider. To help protect against expenses from accidental injury, unexpected medical costs, or critical illness, families have the option to purchase voluntary accident insurance plans. A variety of providers offer different levels of coverage, so families are encouraged to review their options carefully and choose a plan that best meets their needs.

## WV Community Events



### Parent's Guide to Discord



#### General Information

Discord is a communication platform that allows users to interact via text, voice and video. It was initially used by gamers but now has spread to many other groups.

**13** Discord's own policy states that users must be 13 or older. For a person who is younger than 13 to create a Discord account, they have LIED about their age. Unfortunately, students as young as 10 and 11 years have gotten caught up in cyber-bullying and inappropriate activities on Discord.

#### Public & Private Spaces

Discord has PUBLIC spaces (servers) that are available to all. Anything your child posts there can be seen by anyone. PRIVATE spaces are by invitation only.

#### Livestream

Users can stream live video of themselves on Discord, for others to watch. Whether they are on a PRIVATE or PUBLIC server, this could expose them to people they don't know. By watching other people's livestreams, they could be exposed to information that is inappropriate, violent or sexual in nature.

#### Did You Know?

In Canada, cyberbullying and child pornography can be criminal offenses. If your child participates in either of these, while using Discord (or other social media), you, as the parent, can be held liable for what they have done, and be prosecuted by law.

#### Discord at School

West Vancouver Schools DOES NOT allow students to access Discord while using school wifi.

### If your child is under 13

- They SHOULD NOT be using Discord.
- As soon as they enter school grounds, their phone should be put away and not brought out again until they leave school grounds
- Consider holding off on getting them a phone as long as possible and if you do get them a phone, make sure you establish rules and guidelines over its use.

### Did you know?

- DM refers to a private discussion with a certain person on Discord.
- GDM refers to a group messaging situation of up to 10 invited people. Be aware that because of the limit, users can end up feeling left out if they are outside of the 10.
- Through Discord, students can end up being exposed to inappropriate content, cyberbullying and unknown contacts.
- Gamers still make up the lions share of Discord participants. Online gaming is one of the main ways predators groom their victims.

### If your child has Discord

- Make sure they are old enough to be on it - remember, at least 13!!
- Users are able to BLOCK and REPORT other users who are not following community guidelines. Make sure your child knows how to do this.
- Talk to them about their Discord use on a regular basis - find out what they're doing and who they are communicating with.
- Familiarize yourself with all of the safety settings and features then talk to your child about online safety and your family values and rules.
- Remember, YOU are the adult! If your child is not using Discord safely, you can shut off their data or wifi.

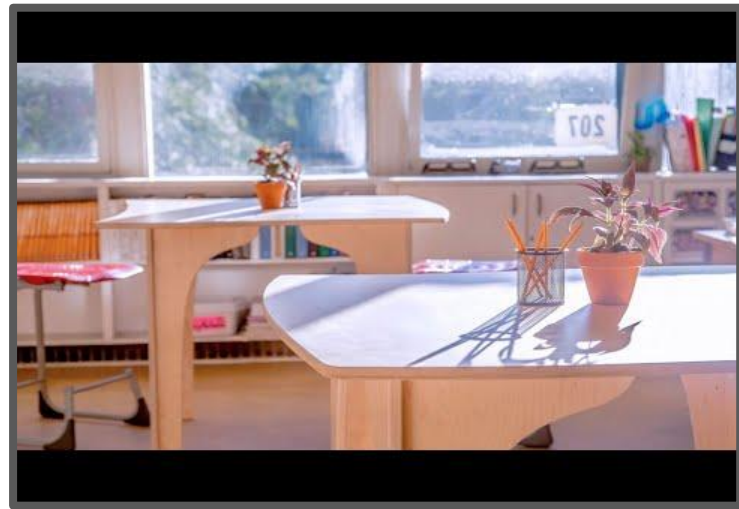
