#### Chair Report - Tamzyn Jones

Whilst there isn't too much to report on from the last general meeting as we have been on Spring Break, the next few weeks and months are very busy leading up to the end of the school year.

I would like to begin by saying thank you to the Persian Community for a wonderful New Year celebration just before Spring Break that was thoroughly enjoyed by the kids.



Next week on April 19th from 7-8.15pm we have our parent education evening on Understanding Anxiety and Anxiety Management Strategies presented by Sharon Shelby who is a registered clinical counsellor. This is a one hour presentation on understanding anxiety in your child and how to develop strategies to overpower it.

Sharon's book 'Surfing the Worry Imp's Wave' will be available to purchase onsite and \$10 from every copy sold will go back to the school. I have a copy here if anyone wants to take a look.

A Mandarin translator will be here as well. Tickets cost \$5 and can be purchased via the eventBrite link sent out to all parents over the weekend.

In addition to this the West Vancouver DPAC is pleased to present a screening of Angst, Raising Awareness Around Anxiety followed by a panel discussion on April 25th at the Kay Meek Theatre. Doors open at 6.30pm and tickets are \$10, available online through the Kay Meek Centre.

There will be special guests from The Foundry, ABLE Developmental Clinic, Child and Youth Mental Health and the West Vancouver School District with time allocated to . The Producers of ANGST have one goal: to start a global conversation and raise awareness around anxiety. Through candid interviews, they utilize the power of film to tell the stories of many kids and teens who discuss their anxiety and its impacts on their lives and relationships, as well as how they have found solutions and hope.

The upcoming Scholastic Book fair is an event that raises a huge amount of money for books and maker space materials (\$2000 in past years). Without parent volunteers this cannot go ahead. The tentative dates are 2-5 days between May 8<sup>th</sup> and May 18th. So far 9 people have signed up but if anyone else is interested please contact Ms. Yorke or Mme Trudeau.

The book fair is set up in the library and families can shop before and after school. As a parent volunteer you help the librarian set up, take down and run the fair.

Our next meeting is our AGM and we have special guest speaker Liz Hill who is the Vice Principal of the School District plus Martina Brazeau who is a homestay manager for our International Programs Office. Input is needed from parents on where to spend PAC funds as we will be looking at the budget during May for our final meeting in June.

There is the possibility of raising funds for a new playground during the next school year. We will be discussing this with facilities this week to see what might be possible.

It is your last chance to register for the Sentinel Spartan Sports camp which begins tomorrow. It runs for 8 weeks, every Wednesday afternoon from 4-6pm until May 30th and costs \$125. All grade 6 and 7 students in the West Vancouver School District are invited to participate. Sentinel teachers and Spartan Coaches are hosting a sports camp where Basketball, volleyball, and various other sports will be offered. Whether you are athletic or simply developing your skillset, all furture Spartans are encouraged to register. There are many positive reasons to take part including making new friends, getting to know Sentinel Secondary School meeting current Sentinel student leaders, teachers and Spartan Coaches, learning about sport and teamplay, developing skills and building athleticism. FESL (Framework for Enhancing Student Learning) and CSL (Communicating Student Learning): Report cards were sent home last Friday. We are now starting Term 3. Assessment results for Term 2 report cards show good progress on our School Goal around Reading and Inquiry. This is Year 3 of our reading and inquiry goal. Parent survey monkey coming out this week.



Student learning surveys: Grade 4/7 parents and students and staff surveyed every spring. April 27<sup>th</sup> deadline.

Athletics: ultimate season under way. Ms. Kos and Karsan are the coaches and practices will be Tuesday at 7:55 and Thursday after school until 4pm. First game April 10<sup>th</sup>.

Lighthouse Festival coming up April 23-27<sup>th</sup>. Sentinel Zone Choral Festival at Kay Meek April 12<sup>th</sup> 4:00.

Do1give: we will do a school-wide "give" day on April 19<sup>th</sup> to support the West Vancouver Foundation Youth Group. Group of student leaders working with Sentinel leader to plan an environmental give to celebrate Earth Day which is on April 22<sup>nd</sup>.

Earth Day assembly and family grouping activities planned for April 20<sup>th</sup>: launch of a new Inquiry Unit linked to our Aboriginal Education Plan and the First Peoples Principle: Learning involves patience and time.

Scholastic Book Fair: we are looking for some parent volunteers to assist Ms. Yorke put on the Book fair. So far we have nobody so we may cancel this event. Would be nice to raise some funds for the Learning Commons but with librarian working only 2 days a week it is not feasible without parent volunteers.
