#### Chair Report - Tamzyn Jones

It has been a very busy few weeks that seem to have passed in a whirlwind for me since the students started back at school early in September. We had a full house at the welcome tea and I hope that everyone who attended found it informative and that it was a positive introduction to Chartwell for all new families. We have set up class parents in all divisions who will be acting as a liaison between the staff, the PAC and all the parents in each class, passing on relevant information in a timely manner and offering support as needed to the teachers. Thank you to all that have volunteered and for sending out all my e-mails in the past few days! Things will settle down at some point I hope!

The hot lunch program was set up for ordering (not an easy task in the timeframe we have) and hot lunch is now being delivered on Tuesdays/Wednesdays and Thursdays. Huge thanks to Brenda for her commitment to making this happen.

We celebrated World Teachers Day last Friday with a luncheon for the staff to show our gratitude for all that they do - thanks you to Jo & Brenda for coordinating this.

This coming Friday we are hosting a Red Cross Babysitters course for students in grades 6&7. This was promoted at the DPAC meeting for students across the district. Once again this is a hugely popular event and is now sold out. Many thanks to Nessa for arranging.

Plans are well underway for the Halloween Dance and we are starting to get ideas together for fundraising got the Grade 7 farewell. More detail will follow on these programs in our committee reports.

As discussed in our budget meeting in May of this year we allocated funds toward the purchase of new tablecloths, aprons and a pop-up tent to be used at various PAC and school related events such as multicultural night and the track meet. We wanted to include a Chartwell PAC logo on these items to recognize and represent our successful PAC. We hope everyone likes the proposed logo which is inspired by the North Shore Mountains and links with the theme of the mural above. We will purchase the items in due course and have the new logo applied where possible.

Many of you may have now seen that the ramp down to the lower playground was completed over the Summer break and gives full accessibility to this area. Due to time constraints the play structure behind the portables on the other side of the building (installed for the younger grades) was not moved. The equipment in the lower playground is nearing its end of life (20+ years) and we would like to start fundraising for new equipment in the new year with a view to having it replaced next Summer ready for the 2019/20 school year. The equipment for the younger grades was replaced in 2009 so still has many years of use left. As part of an overall project we will decide the best location for this in regard to the current positioning and use and how it may be incorporated into the lower area as we investigate new equipment, grants and a fundraising campaign to replace the old equipment. We will need a team of volunteers to be involved in this, headed by Nessa and more information will follow over the coming months.



One last thing to mention is that there is a West Van School Traffic Safety Sharing Session being held next Wednesday October 24th from 9:30-11:00 AM at the Inglewood Learning Centre. All parents who have traffic concerns or ideas relating to our school and the neighboring areas are invited to attend. If you are interested, please let me know and I can forward the details.

#### Principal's Report - Madame Trudeau

**Athletics:** cross country season underway with 32 members this year, great improvement from last year. Last Meet October 9th

Basketball season started with practices before school on Tuesday and after school on Thursday. First game Oct 23rd. Letter with schedule is being sent with students today. Thanks to coaches Ms. Fry. Ms. Karsan, Ms. Sasaerilla, Ms. Kos and Mr. Philip.

**School cash online:** We're over 88% at this point. A reminder that we are not accepting cash at school this year, so parents need to make an account. Come to the office to get your PIN.

**Terry Fox Assembly and run:** Perfect day for our run on September 27th. Assembly led by 6/7 students. We have raised around \$500 and our goal was \$2500.

**Orange Day Shirt activities:** Friday September 28th we had an assembly to wrap up the week's activities in the Learning Commons led by classroom teachers and Ms. Yorke.

**FSA 'season':** starting this week but students will have time to practice and prepare in class. Letter for parents sent home on October 1st.

**After School programs:** we have started Chess Club (Monday), Something Cool after School (Tuesday), Art Mania (Wednesday) and Badminton (Friday). Lasermasters is cancelled.

**Pro. D**: on September 21st was well spent by staff who developed a school-wide inquiry unit tied to our Aboriginal Education Plan revolving around the First Peoples Principle of Learning "Learning involves recognizing the consequences of one's actions".

#### Hot Lunch - Brenda Weeks

- Hot Lunch Program is in its 1st Term
- Last year we brought in about \$35,000.
- We have 198 orders in the first term of this year
- Total sales \$34,351.40
- 25% profit of \$8.739.42
- New Vendors have been selected: Presto Catering, and Papa Johns
- Returning Vendors: Katsu Sushi, Foodie Kids, and Subway
- The Days that hot lunch is being offered has changed this year to every Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Term we are going to be offering an additional day of hot lunch which will be Friday's
- New Vendor for 2nd Term will be Libby's Kitchen Offering a Chinese food menu
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Term hot lunch ordering will be open up in late December
- We need new volunteers for the second term and for the additional added day
- We are proposing to get rid of all plastic utensils and purchasing reusable utensils that children can keep in their desk

#### Spirit Wear - Nessa van Bergen

- School district will not allow us to sell spirit wear directly from West Van server, we have to use a 3<sup>rd</sup> party vendor
  - Jo has a 3<sup>rd</sup> party provider that we can investigate
- New item: Golf Shirt will not be offered in kids sizes, but XS can fit 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> graders
- Umbrella not enough orders from last year so got dropped
  - This year combining sentinel and Chartwell logos to represent both school
- Possible spirit wear swap

- Repeating the most successful events from last year
- Doing away with movie nights as they were not very profitable
- Mahsa working on yearbook this year
- Putting together budgets
  - Previous farewell team to give this year's farewell team budget from last year as frame of reference
- Brenda suggested Dedication page to be purchased by parents as additional fundraiser



# BC Fruits and Vegetable Program - Brenda Weeks

- A program that provides students with fresh local fruits and vegetables
- This program started with an idea in 2004 and as of 2017 they went from serving 10 schools to 1400 K-12 schools and K-12 First Nations schools in BC
- The program is non-profit and it takes about 4000 volunteers to provide fresh services of fruits and vegetables every other week, 12 times on a school year to about 571,000 students.
- This program is great because it exposes kids to try new fruits and vegetables
- Increases awareness of locally grown foods
- Supports the local economy
- Students have already received: apples, blueberries
- They will next be getting a variety of apples, pears, cucumbers, carrots, peppers, mandarins, and tomatoes
- November 6 is the next scheduled delivery
