- Chinese food vendor, Libby's Kitchen, added for fourth day of hot lunch this term
- Libby's kitchen 108 orders
- Presto doing well about 165 orders
- Over 200 orders for Papa John's pizza
- Sushi almost 130 orders
- First term 198 orders, second 186 orders
- Made about \$35k
- Still have \$900 owed by parents
- Challenge is getting volunteers if we are struggling with volunteers moving into the 3rd term, we will consider dropping fourth day. It's not sustainable without parent volunteers. It's not fair for the same parents cover the entire year.
- Need forward thinking in volunteers, not just for the month.
- Can there be a proposal for those who order, they must volunteer at least once a month? Hot lunch can't run unless parents volunteer. Someone from the Chinese community needs to help. Take on filling in their names on line since the signup website is only in English.
- Any ideas on how to recognize parents who volunteer at the end of the year and any ideas of how to incentivize parents to volunteer need to go to Grace, Lisa, and Brenda. Maybe assign divisions responsible for a time frame of when those parents are required to help out with hot lunch.
