#### Chair's Report

Thank you to Persian community for a wonderful day celebrating Norwuz - the kids had a fabulous time and learnt so much. It is another amazing example of what can be achieved when

a group of people come together as a team to organize an event that gives us all an insight to things they are passionate about.

DPAC Sleep Presentation - Importance of physical activity and promoting sleep as a key component of this

Benefits of physical activity have a huge impact to individuals, families and communities 24hr movement guidelines include sleep as well as sweat, step and sit

Only approx. 15% of youth meet recommended sweat (1hr) / 7% meet recommended step / 49% elementary & 6% high school meet recommended sit

1 in 4 kids not getting enough sleep, as kids get older less and less likely to get enough sleep as move through high school. Has a direct impact on mental health. An even lower percentage report good quality of sleep.

Only 17.5% children and youth are meeting all guidelines, there a lot of work to be done Moving beyond physical activity towards physical literacy which involves - motivation + confidence + physical competence + knowledge & understanding in order to value and take responsibility for engagement in physical activity for life

Hot lunch volunteers are needed after Spring Break. We will be launching a competition once we are back - the division with the highest number of volunteer hours will win a TCBY party towards the end of the school year - more details to follow. We hope that initiatives like this will encourage people to volunteer their time. Any ideas for how we can promote interest in helping with this program are appreciated.
