Strong Start BC Early Learning programs

- Ministry of Education resides in HUB, but is a district program
- 3 in West Vancouver School district
 - Eagle Harbour
 - Hollyburn
 - Chartwell
- Many of the children move into the elementary the hub is located at or a surrounding school
- Started 5 years ago
- Focus to work with families and caregivers to create educational goals
- Area of focus physical growth and mental stimulation along with the caregivers in all of

our communities. We have vulnerabilities that may get in the way of childhood growth

- Use EDI to pinpoint where HUBs are needed
- It is being utilized by the immediate community
- In 7th wave of EDI, but from wave 6 our vulnerability rate is going up which means children of Vancouver are not getting everything they need for healthy childhood growth
- There is a Teddy Bear picnic in September to connect the community, child comes with parent or caregiver
- 75 children registered at the Chartwell HUB, only 15 are in attendance at a time
- Community health care makes visits, Northshore Family counselling comes 3 times per year, dental hygienist come 3 times per year
- All are school based, but there are a few community outreach sights (community centre)
- Open to all children prior to kindergarten
- All children get BC registration pin numbers and taught by early childhood educators
- Gave examples of families that utilize the HUB, parents and grandparents that also use
 it as a network to get in contact with other parents and caregivers that participate
- As families come to these HUBs they connect with West Van School District
- Pictures drawn and stories told by the children and recorded
- Program is so popular that people are being turned away
- Being funded by the municipality
- Very happy with the response of the families
- With strong start they are seeing direct correlation between the kids who are in Strong Start enrolling into West Vancouver schools and has proven to be very effective in connecting families to West Vancouver schools
