## 1. Chair's Welcome

2. Special Guest Speakers:

Chris Kennedy-14 years in this district, 10.5 as superintendent- Works with the West Vancouver School Board and principals therein

- Covid:
- Vaccinations- all staff was given 1st dose 2 weeks age
- Youth vaccines? Pfizer is approved aged 12 and up- no plans to give in the schools; use Provincial registration system Timing? 1st dose before end of June-will announce soon
- VCH-decline in exposure notices....5-6/ day right after spring break...now 1-2 week, mostly Secondary...real decline in exposures...Exposure notices come very quickly
- VCH put reg vaccine programs on hold, catch up plan after Covid vaccine
- Rapid test kits will be placed in all schools...if child gets sick, parents will be offered kit to drop off at life labs
- Fall elementary schools: opinion: Will see probably relaxing of cohorts in the fall and sports activities
- To stay- masks and hand washing, distancing when possible, limiting of gatherings; staggering will continue to some degree; 2 staggered entries
- Secondary in fall: Special program for Grade 8 because transition in the spring hasn't happened; semester system; will be building more flexible time; Planning for full sports schedule and Kay Meek assemblies
- Outdoor learning very much a focus(garden boxes); have learned new ways of teaching and kids' engagement- the playground looks great! Physical literacy is a push-life skills about being active engaged in risky play; Important to start early for a life of activity


## Carolyn Broady- Board of Education Chair

- Sets strategic direction of schools and in charge of budget
- Elected to support and improve student achievement: setting courses, calendars, while Superintendent runs day to day operations- "Chris comes with his "audacious "goals and the board supports the efforts
- Strategic Plan- Goal for educational excellence in academic achievement allowing kids to follow their passions and be successful as they can be;
- Work very hard with student transitions and assuring welcoming schools to make these transitions easier
- Visionary leadership-working with our partners-creating community connections
- Frustrating as a board that the entire focus has been on Covid; Goal in September is to move things forward with mental health support for families and students and staff; supporting the most vulnerable students; and refocus on learning transformation and best practices
