## **Student and Family Affordability Fund:**

The Ministry of Education has provided West Vancouver Schools \$650,000, a one-time funding for us to make the 22/23 school year more affordable for students and families in need. We have now received the funding for our 18 schools and have allocated the money based on the specific needs of each of our school communities. Our allocation:

- Will allow schools to cover costs for school fees, school supplies or other school related costs for students in need
- Some funds will be used to benefit large groups of both elementary and secondary students

Families are encouraged to reach out to their principal if any financial support is needed for school-based supplies, fees or activities.

## Traffic and Parking:

Parents are reminded to follow all traffic signs and procedures when entering or exiting the school. There is no left turn at the top when exiting during pick up and drop off. This ensures safety for any students using the crosswalk and allows traffic to flow.

If your child is not ready when you are at the front of the line, you must exit out of the school to Chartwell Drive and re-enter the cue. You cannot simply rejoin the roundabout as this also causes a backup of traffic. There is no parking in the staff parking area during drop off or pick up.
