First, we've had several bear sightings near the school recently. While there have been no sightings this week, we are continuing to focus on safety and making sure all

students are BEAR AWARE. Tomorrow morning, we will be hosting a Bear Information Session for all students, where we'll review important safety tips. Here are a few simple rules of thumb for black bear safety on school grounds that we are sharing with students:

Walk in groups. Bears tend to avoid large groups of people, so sticking together is a simple way to stay safe. Stay calm and move away slowly if you ever see a bear. Do not run.







training!


