Dear Chartwell Families,

This week, I want to highlight the significant impact that daily home reading

can have on our students' literacy development. Engaging in just 20 minutes of reading each day has been shown to enhance vocabulary,

comprehension, critical thinking skills and overall academic performance. For Our Primary Students: In the early years, reading is all about building confidence and establishing foundational skills. Encourage your child to explore a variety of genres and discuss the stories to enhance comprehension. As your child explores books

at home, try to ask them simple questions about the story, such as "What

happened first?" or "How did the character feel?" These types of discussions support comprehension and their critical thinking about the text. Don't be afraid to read together, taking turns and pausing to talk about new words or ideas. For Our Intermediate Students: As students move into the intermediate grades, reading builds fluency and comprehension. Encourage independent reading, but check in on their progress. Ask open-ended questions like, "What do you think will happen

next?" or "Why did the character make that choice?" Setting small goals, such as reading a certain number of pages or chapters each week, can help maintain motivation and keep reading a regular part of their routine. For our English Language Learners, daily reading is especially beneficial. You can support your child by reading together in English or their home language, if possible, to strengthen their understanding of both languages.

Don't hesitate to use bilingual books, as these can offer extra support in their

language development and make reading a more enjoyable and inclusive


