I recently read an insightful article in *Teacher Magazine* by Stacey MacLean,



These practices are all designed to create a supportive, predictable environment where students feel safe and confident to

As we continue to work together to support our students, we'd like to highlight one small but important way to help: arriving on time. While we know traffic can be challenging, arriving between 8:40 and 8:45 gives students the opportunity to settle in, connect with their teachers and classmates, and start the day feeling prepared. This unstructured time helps students who experience anxiety to feel grounded before the day's routine begins.


We believe that by working together—home and school—we can help our students build resilience and emotional intelligence, skills that are just as important as academic success. Warm regards, Sara Bell






