Field trips are one of the most memorable and enriching parts of the school experience. They give students the chance to take their learning beyond the classroom walls, to see

curriculum come to life, and to connect what they are studying with the wider world. Whether it is exploring local history, engaging with the arts, or participating in hands-on science activities, these experiences can spark curiosity, deepen understanding, and build lasting memories. At the same time, it is important to share that field trips are not planned lightly. Teachers

take great care when selecting excursions. Each trip is considered with the following in mind: **Curriculum connection** – Trips must extend or enhance the learning already happening in class. The goal is to build on what students are learning, not replace it.

Quality of programming – We look for experiences that are engaging, age-appropriate, and thoughtfully designed to support student learning. **Safety and supervision** – Both the activity itself and the setting are reviewed carefully

to ensure student safety. The maturity of the students is always factored in. **Cost considerations** – Pricing is weighed to make sure trips are accessible and

provide value to families. District guidelines – All field trips must follow the West Vancouver School District's

Because of these considerations, not every suggestion or opportunity can be taken up




