

Dear Chartwell Families.

As we move into the final weeks of December, I want to express how grateful we are for the incredible generosity of our community. Our food collection for the Harvest Project has been a meaningful reminder of the gift of giving and the impact our students can have when they come together with purpose.

The Harvest Project supports families on the North Shore who are experiencing food insecurity, and our students have been highly motivated to help. In our Tree House groups, classes read Maddie's Fridge and Saturday at the Food Pantry to deepen their understanding of what food insecurity can look like—and the importance of kindness, empathy, and community support.

We are also continuing our technology fundraiser and are happy to share that we have surpassed 50% of our goal. We are hoping to purchase at least 10 additional iPads, and we are just under \$5,000 away from making that possible. If your family is able to contribute in any way, your support would be greatly appreciated and would directly benefit students across all grade levels.

Registration for 2025-2026

Applications for Kindergarten (incatchment, out of catchment and out of district) AND for in-catchment registrations in Grades 1-12 are open.

Out of catchment and out of district will open January 15, 2026

Please note that <u>current Chartwell</u> <u>students are not required to re-apply</u> for the next school year. Grade 7 students going to Sentinel also do not need to apply, they will automatically transfer. Sentinel counsellors will visit us in late winter/early spring to distribute transfer forms at that time. HOWEVER, if your first choice for a secondary school is not Sentinel then you must complete an online application according to the student registration timelines.


WV Community Corner
