
STUDENT ILLNESS

We were thrilled to have our entire school community run for Terry yesterday. We had and assembly and a teacher led cheer in the gym. Thank you to all the parent volunteers and spectators!

Terry Fox, a Canadian hero, embodied unparalleled courage, unwavering strength, and an enduring hope that continues to inspire those battling cancer worldwide. In 1980, diagnosed with bone cancer, he embarked on a remarkable journey, running a marathon a day across Canada on his prosthetic leg, known as the Marathon of Hope. Despite his own physical challenges, Terry Fox's indomitable will ignited a beacon of hope for countless individuals facing similar hardships. TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION



Cypress Park school will recognize Orange Shirt Day on Friday, September 29th, and all children, staff and families are invited to wear an orange shirt. This day, and the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, is to honour the legacy of indigenous, inuit and Metis children in Canada who were taken from their homes and sent to residential schools between the 1830s and 1980s. West Bay students will learn, in an age-appropriate way, about the theme of the day, "Every Child Matters." A reminder that Monday, October 2, is a national holiday.


PARKING INFORMATION AND SAFE ARRIVAL INFORMATION It is important to ensure that getting to and from school is safe for all students. Please do your part to follow Cypress Park's drop-off and pick-up procedures and expectations.

- Slow down. Obey 30 km/hr. speed limits in school and playground zones
- Yield for pedestrians at ALL times
- When crossing the street use designated crosswalks only

• Please do not enter the staff parking area, this is for the safety of your children and to avoid any vehicle backups.

Obey all posted parking signs – especially in the drop off areas immediately in front of the school; please be respectful of accessible spaces and reserved parking spots
 Parking along Morgan Crescent is for diagonal parking only. There is no parking on the left side of the street on Morgan. Additional designated parking is on right hand

side of Marine Dr beside the school field.
Students are to line-up outside their classroom doors. Parents should not enter the classrooms at arrival times.
