COMMUNICATION CORNER - OCTOBER

As we are in Year 3 of our FESL (Framework for Enhancing Student Learning) goal, we would like to highlight the different forms of communication at Cypress Park.

FESL GOAL: Through the implementation of inclusive practices and a team-based approach, how can the literacy achievement, (communication and writing skills) of learners be improved?

We use Seesaw for a variety of purposes at Cypress Park; to show learning over time both as individuals and as group learners, to reflect on our learning and to communicate learning to parents.

Becoming involved in your child's learning can start with interacting with Seesaw. Child: "Did you SEE my picture?" Parent: "I SAW your picture" (get it...Seesaw)



We encourage you and your child to converse about their learning when viewing the pictures. You could also share a comment or question in the comment section. For example, try using some of our IB language such as..

- "I see you were a communicator/ risk-taker/ principled etc."
- "What are your next steps?"
- "Tell me more..."
- "What went well, what would you do differently."

HALLOWEEN GUIDELINES

As students and families start to think about costumes, to ensure the day is fun for everyone, please observe the following dos and don'ts:

Feel welcome to dress in a costume or not.

Continue to avoid costumes that promote cultural stereotypes. Absolutely **no weapons** (swords, lightsabers, nunchucks etc.) and please



make sure costumes are school appropriate.

Wear something comfortable that can be worn all day. Remember they will be working and playing throughout the day so please make sure your child is comfortable (lots of face paint for example is uncomfortable).

Please arrive in costume – there will be no changing in the washrooms.

Avoid scented items that might irritate others (e.g. some hair colouring products)

 Our costume parade will be held **outdoors at 8:40am**, rain or shine. Student Parents are asked to spread-out around the school and bring an umbrella.

Students should avoid bringing in Halloween candy to school, as eating high sugar foods, and/or the idea of eating high-sugar foods, often distracts students from learning. Candy may be held for students and returned at the end of the day but is best avoided to begin with. (remember no nuts)

THE PARADE: Please arrive on time on the 31st. Students will go to their classes as per normal, where teachers will take attendance. Students will exit the school via their exterior classroom door and walk around the school. Please give the students space. The classes will keep moving. Bring an umbrella just in case! We will take lots of photos throughout the day so if you are unable to make the parade please do not worry!



K-3 UNIVERSAL SNACK PROGRAM

The province's <u>Feeding Futures</u> program is a new Ministry of Education & Child Care initiative focused on investing, building, and expanding local school food programs by developing universal, barrier free access to nutritious meals and snacks to students at no cost.

As part of West Vancouver Schools Feeding Futures Initiative, a K-3 Universal Snack Program (USP) launched yesterday in all Kindergarten to Grade Three classrooms.

We are excited a healthy snack will be offered to our students once a week. The menu for the first 10 weeks is below. Parents are asked to continue to send a snack from home on these days as teachers may be offering the USP snacks at different times during the day that may not align with the morning recess snack time. Things to consider if your child feels unwell : 1. Without proper rest, a child may have a hard time fighting an illness or be at risk for other illnesses.

2. The ability of your child to actively take part and learn at school.

3. The school staff cannot care for a sick child and give them the support that they may need.

4. The protection of other children

Please keep your child home if they :

Have a fever
Are too sick to take part in all normal school activities
Have a suspected or known communicable disease (i.e. strep throat, chicken pox or measles)
Is vomiting or has diarrhea. It is recommended that students be symptom free for at least 24 hours before returning to School.
