VOLUNTARY ABSENCES FROM SCHOOL Please understand that if you are choosing to take extended holidays when classes are in session, teachers cannot replicate the learning that happens within the classroom and are not able to provide online learning opportunities. Our teachers do their very best to support students during required absences due to illness, however, when the absence is voluntary and a family's choice (such as extending a weekend, holiday, or vacation), it is a family's responsibility to maintain academic learning at home. Please take time to read with your child, have them write in a "holiday" journal, and take advantage of other opportunities to practice foundational skills (e.g. following instructions and using math while cooking). Families may email their child's teacher(s) to see if there is other work their child can do, however, our teachers' energy and focus continues to be on the learning and safety of students within the classroom.

COMMUNICATION CORNER NOVEMBER

As learners and teachers at Cypress Park, we have been thinking in-depth about our FESL goal on communication and building inclusive practices to express ideas, thoughts and feelings. Our grade 3 leaders have been immersed in their inquiry on How we Express Ourselves and have been communicators by sharing ideas on how Indigenous animals could be connected to our IB learner profile. This investigation was sparked by our visit from the Squamish language teacher Alroy Baker, who visited our school a few weeks ago to teach us about Indigenous animals using puppets. It served as a provocation to spark curiosity and connection. Grade 3's have been communicators and critical thinkers by sharing ideas about which animals connect to which Learner Profile. Another highlight of the Inquiry Unit has been having guest visitor Isaac Vanderhorst from the West Vancouver Art Museum for the past three Thursdays to help create animal masks.

ATE AND ABSENT POLICY




