

IF YOU DO NOT HAVE AN ACCOUNT



All new parents will have received an email on November 3rd from sysadmin@myeducation.gov.bc.ca or admin@myeducation.gov.bc.ca providing a temporary one-time password - you would have been asked to create a new password immediately. If you did not receive an email check your junkmail first as it could be in that folder. We encourage you to set up the Family Portal on receipt of your email with a new password and practice navigating the site so that you are ready for Report Cards, ELL Reports and IEPs when they are published on 8th December.

Please remember that if you have an older child in high school, you already have an account and can see all your children on that one account. These reports will only be available until 31st January 2024, so we advise you to download and save for future reference.

VOLUNTARY ABSENCES FROM SCHOOL Please understand that if you are choosing to take extended holidays when classes are in session, teachers cannot replicate the learning that happens within the classroom and are not able to provide online learning opportunities. Our teachers do their very best to support students during required absences due to illness, however, when the absence is voluntary and a family's choice (such as extending a weekend, holiday, or vacation), it is a family's responsibility to maintain academic learning at home. Please take time to read with your child, have them write in a "holiday" journal, and take advantage of other opportunities to practice foundational skills (e.g. following instructions and using math while cooking). Families may email their child's teacher(s) to see if there is other work their child can do, however, our teachers' energy and focus continues to be on the learning and safety of students within the classroom.

## ATE AND ABSENT POLICY

We realized that sometimes things come up in the morning beyond your control, however when students come to class late, it disrupts the flow of morning routine, distract other students and impede learning. One of the most important things your child can do to reach the goal of success is also one of the most basic: attend school every day on time!



\*\*If your child is arriving late to school, please drop them off outside the undercover entrance door. Our outside door is unlocked, do not ring the bell, your child can enter the school on their own and report their lateness to the office.

If for any reason your child is scheduled to be absent, arriving late after the morning bell at 8:30am, or you have an early departure scheduled for your child, please be sure to advise your classroom teacher via email and email the school office or call our voicemail system. Cypress Park has to account for each student's whereabouts. This system is for your child's protection. How It Works: If you know that your child will be absent or late for school, please do the following:

Telephone 604-981-1330 and follow the prompts. Leave a message with: Child's name, teacher, grade # and anticipated length of absence

Have a suspected or known communicable disease (i.e. strep throat, chicken pox or measles)

Is vomiting or has diarrhea. It is recommended that students be symptom free for at least 24 hours before returning to School.


