Have a suspected or known communicable disease (i.e. <u>pink eye</u>, <u>strep throat</u>, <u>chicken</u>

pox, measles, or hand foot and mouse disease.)
Is vomiting or has diarrhea. It is recommended that students be symptom free for at least 24 hours before returning to School.
