WHEN SHOULD I KEEP MY SICK CHILD HOME FROM SCHOOL?

- Things to consider if your child feels unwell : 1. Without proper rest, a child may have a hard time fighting an illness or be at risk for other illnesses.
 - 2. The ability of your child to actively take part and learn at school. 3. The school staff cannot care for a sick child and give them the
 - support that they may need.
 - 4. The protection of other children

Please keep your child home if they :

- Have a fever
- Are too sick to take part in all normal school activities
- Have a suspected or known communicable disease (i.e. <u>pink eye</u>, <u>strep throat</u>, <u>chicken</u> pox, measles, or hand foot and mouse disease.)
- Is vomiting or has diarrhea. It is recommended that students be symptom free for at least 24 hours before returning to School.
