## APPROVAL OF MEETING MINUTES

## BUDGET OVERVIEW

## FUNDING FUTURES

The amount raised has been $\$ 2,300$ for a while now. Recently, the PAC has highlighted the following Funding Futures sponsorship opportunities: literacy and technology (total budget of $\$ 11,200$ ), events and experts in residence (total budget of $\$ 9,770$ ), teaching resources and wish list (total budget of $\$ 10,703$ ); however, no additional sponsorships have been made.

With the $\$ 2,300$ raised, the following purchases have been made this year:

- 2x Pokeman books
- 1x Babysitters Little Sister book
- 2x Rory Branagan books

We need to brainstorm ideas on how to reboot this fundraising initiative to get more sponsorship. The following ideas were discussed:

1. Posters
2. Print-outs in backpacks
3. Birthday Party Gifts
4. Sponsorship incentives such as plaques, recognition, spirit wear etc.
5. Positive feedback around messaging: "This is your chance to vote. Sponsor the items that are important to you \& your family."

The PAC discussed that new parents might not be aware of Funding Futures, and it might be too inconvenient to access in the e-bulletin. There was discussion on whether a more concise version should be sent home in backpacks, or whether the full list should be sent home to make it easier for parents, so they don't have to use a QR code etc. We discussed bringing back coffee mornings and lemonade afternoons and having the posters and booklets out at those events so we can get the conversations going. We agreed to do a printout in back packs, and additional coffee mornings and lemonade tables with the booklet available at these events.

## GRANTS

- District Gaming Grant: The application was denied at the beginning of the year, and then the PAC re-submitted grant details and past reports. The grant was just approved, and the school received $\$ 2,000$. A big thank you to R. Vernon for working on the application.
- Whole Kids Foundation Grant: This is due on this coming Friday, the PAC is going to pass on this grant because of the Feeding Futures program (see below).
- Feeding Futures: Approved for Earth bites, Garden Programs and lunch program - has agreed to fund earth bites and the garden program.
- Thank you to R. Vernon and C Hulme for your help with the grants!
