APPROVAL OF MEETING MINUTES

BUDGET OVERVIEW

He asked if there was a way to broaden the experts in residence offerings to include finance or business. The PAC discussed if this might be an area the parent experts could come in and speak to. There is an entrepreneur fair that shows kids with their businesses at a young age. N. Quilty noted that West Bay has a Christmas Craft fair, where each Cypress Park market day where children set up tables to sell their items. C. Hulme noted that there is a program called Powerplay for young entrepreneurs. It involved a teacher taking on a 6-8 week program in class. Students learn financial literacy, and a portion of

Member J Perez brought up the use of screens and smartphones for young children. She contacted the founder of Wait until Grade 8. She noted that many new policies have been brought in this year by different levels of government around smartphones for students. This is a pledge for parents to make if they don't want to give their children smartphones. Unplugged is the website. Every year the pledge is renewed. So far there are no cellphones at Cypress Park. Making the pledge lets parents know they are supported by other parents in their children's peer group.

ADMIN UPDATE

C. Hulme provided the Admin update:

- Pink shirt day assembly was a success all grade 3s had the option of taking part. The history of pink shirt day was taught with an emphasis on kindness.
- The Grade 3 skating field trip with West Bay was a success. Students all played at the courtyard afterwards.
- The Nowruz ceremony was wonderful. Superintendent Kennedy attended at the end of the event.
- Yoga for all 4 grades was a hit.
- Dynamo fencing for all 4 grades was also successful.
- It would be nice to have these programs a second time so they can build on the momentum from the first session.
- First Earthbites was a success. Nice for parents to be a part of it. Next one is next Friday, May 10th.
- The Lockdown drill was last Monday each school has to practice for a potential indoor threat. The WVPD was here to support it. If anyone was anxious the counselor was onsite. The students did very well.
- There is a new counselor Ms. Taylor.
- Earth day there was a school wide ground clean up which has inspired students to continue to clean up the community.
- The school is receiving the new Whale (Beaty) Box.
- Staff appreciation lunch was very generous thank you to the PAC.
- Run Club 8:10 start time on May 7th (see above).
- Student led conferences next week on 2 separate days. Note that after school programs will still happen on those days, so pack a lunch. Program will start at 12:40.
- As mentioned above, there will be the Welcome to Kindergarten event and the VP for the day coming up.
- Each school has to set a 3-year progression for their FESL. This will be year 3 for Cypress Park. Teachers have wanted to look at literacy and writing skills for students

this year. There will be a year end presentation on June 3rd to the school district leadership team. Voice and Choice is the name of the presentation. Next year will be a new 3-year cycle.

- Sports day is another early dismissal date.
- Spring concert June 10th in gym at 2:00pm. Mme. Oancea is organizing this. Students will be performing different songs using instruments.
- During the upcoming May PAC meeting A. Anderson will attend as IB administrator. C. Hulme will also give an update on the summary of learning.

COMMITTEES

The PAC executive is looking at vacancies for next year. R. Vernon is only at CPP for one more year and would like to be co-treasurer with someone next year so there is an onboarding. 




