

CYPRESS PARK PARENT INFORMATION EVENING - September 26th 5-6pm

Cypress Park families are invited to attend our Parent Info Evening. This is a great opportunity for families to meet their child's/children's teacher(s) and learn about the year ahead. The evening will start in the gym and be followed by two session in classrooms.



Here are the key details:

- This event is for parents/guardians only.
- 5:00-5:15 PM, Principal Scott Slater, Vice-Principal Christine Hulme, and IB Coordinator Morikke Espenhain will give an overview of what learning and inquiry looks like at Cypress Park
- 5:20-5:35 PM, parents will find their child's classroom for Session #1. Teachers will introduce themselves and their classroom and share information about classroom routines and how parents can support their child's education.
- 5:40-5:55 PM, parents who have two children at Cypress Park will find their other child's classroom for Session #2 which is a repeat of Session #1.
- 6:00 PM, Event Ends

This evening is not for conversations about individual student learning. However, individual Student Learning Conferences will be held on October 22nd and 23rd. Sign up for the conferences will be online, and more information will follow in future bulletins.


SAFE ARRIVAL AND PICK UP INFORMATION

It is important to ensure that getting to and from school is safe for all students. Please do your part to follow Cypress Park's drop-off and pick-up procedures and expectations.

- Slow down. Obey 30 km/hr. speed limits in school and playground zones
- Yield for pedestrians at ALL times
- When crossing the street use designated crosswalks only
- Please do not enter the staff parking area, this is for the safety of your children and to avoid any vehicle backups.
- Obey all posted parking signs especially in the drop off areas immediately in front of the school; please be respectful of accessible spaces and reserved parking spots
- Parking along Morgan Crescent is for diagonal parking only. There is no parking on the left side of the street on Morgan. Additional designated parking is on right hand side of Marine Dr beside the school field.
- Students are to line-up outside their classroom doors. Parents should not enter the classrooms at arrival times.

Please communicate this information to any other individuals who may be dropping off or picking up children.

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY

We would like to take a moment to emphasize the importance of regular school attendance and punctuality.

Consistent Attendance Matters: Every day in school is an opportunity for your child to learn, grow, and thrive. Regular attendance ensures they don't miss out on valuable classroom experiences and educational milestones. It's the foundation for success in their academic journey.



Vacations During School Time: While we understand that family vacations are a cherished tradition, we encourage you to plan them during school breaks whenever possible. Missing school for extended periods can disrupt your child's learning progress and make it challenging for them to catch up on missed lessons.

On-Time Arrival: Being on time is equally crucial. It sets a positive tone for the day and allows your child to settle in, engage with peers, and benefit fully from classroom instruction. Punctuality fosters good habits that will serve them well throughout life.

Late Arrival Policy: If your child is arriving late to school, please drop them off outside the undercover entrance door. The door is unlocked, there is no reason to ring the bell. Your child can enter the school on their own and report to the front office. Ms. Thoma will check them in, and help them to their classrooms.

Your partnership in ensuring your child's regular attendance and punctuality greatly contributes to their success in school. We appreciate your support and commitment to their education. Thank you for being an essential part of our school community.

VOLUNTARY ABSENCES FROM SCHOOL

Please understand that if you are choosing to take extended holidays when classes are in session, teachers cannot replicate the learning that happens within the classroom and are not able to provide online learning opportunities.

Our teachers do their very best to support students during required absences due to illness, however, when the absence is voluntary and a family's choice (such as extending a weekend, holiday, or vacation), it is a family's responsibility to maintain academic learning at home.

Please take time to read with your child, have them write in a "holiday" journal, do Math IXL online, or take advantage of other emergent opportunities to practise foundational skills (e.g. following instructions and using math while cooking).

Families may email their child's teacher(s) to see if there is other work their child can do, however, our teachers' energy and focus continues to be on the learning of students within the classroom

This double-feature screening explores Haida culture and resilience through two impactful films. *Beyond Being Silenced: Gyaa Isdlaa* follows Haida artist Robert Davidson as he stages a potlatch to honour Indigenous resilience, acknowledging past abuses while celebrating cultural renewal. *Waaydanaa: Now is the Time* revisits the historic moment when 22-year-old Davidson carved and raised the first new totem pole on Haida Gwaii in nearly a century, marking the rebirth of the Haida spirit.

Movie Matinée: Bones of Crows

Monday, September 30, 2 - 4:15 p.m.

Bones of Crows tells the epic story of Cree matriarch Aline Spears, chronicling her experiences in the residential school system and the intergenerational impact on her family. This film offers an unflinching portrayal of the long-lasting effects of systemic injustice on Indigenous communities.
