# **STUDENT ILLNESS**



### WHEN SHOULD I KEEP MY SICK CHILD HOME FROM SCHOOL?

Things to consider if your child feels unwell :

1. Without proper rest, a child may have a hard time fighting an illness or be at risk for other illnesses.

2. The ability of your child to actively take part and learn at school.

3. The school staff cannot care for a sick child and give them the support that they may need.

4. The protection of other children

Please keep your child home if they :

Have a fever

Are too sick to take part in all normal school activities

 Have a suspected or known communicable disease (i.e. strep throat, chicken pox or measles)

 Is vomiting or has diarrhea. It is recommended that students be symptom free for at least 24 hours before returning to School.

If the school finds it necessary to send your child home because of illness, please make sure you have arranged an emergency contact if you are not available. <u>Inform you school of these arrangements</u>.

### COMING SOON PARENT / TEACHER LEARNING CONFERENCES OCTOBER 22nd and 23rd

#### Getting the Most Out of Them

On Tuesday and Wednesday, October 22 and 23 will be dismissing students early at **12:00 NOON** to provide the opportunity for Parent / Teacher Learning Conferences.

Parent / Teacher Learning Conferences have been referred to as the speed-dating of the education world. We know that time slots are short, but that doesn't mean they can't be effective. The value of the home-school connections is really important and benefits our children, so here are a few tips to help you get the most from this valuable time.

#### Write Your Questions Down

Before your time, really think through any questions you have or concerns you might want to address. You may wish the teacher's perspective on books to recommend or maybe ways to support your child's reading development. This is the time.

#### Get Your Child's Input

While we are asking parents to leave their child at home for these conferences it can be beneficial to ask your child if they have any questions. If they are young and new to the idea, explain that these conferences are helpful for both the teacher and the parents to ensure everyone is working together so they can have a positive school year.

Ask them: Is there's anything they think is important to discuss.

#### Ask this Question

My favourite question to ask as a parent is a simple one: "How can I support my child at home?" This gives teachers an opportunity to talk about academic or social areas in which your child would benefit from help or reinforcement. Please don't ask "So how's my kids doing?" or "How does my kid compare to other kids in the class?" These types of questions are broad and not helpful to supporting your child.

#### Stick to the Schedule

Most of the time the 10 minute conference is going to feel sufficient, but if you feel like your child is struggling at all this probably will not feel like enough time to problem solve. Remember, though, that this can be the start of the conversation, not the end. If you hit on an issue that requires more conversation than you can fit in, make a plan to follow-up through email, phone, or another meeting. This isn't your only opportunity to talk to your child's teacher for the rest of the school year.
