





IB STUDENT LEARNING HIGHLIGHTS

KINDERGARTEN OUTDOOR CLASSROOM

Each morning, we start our day in our outdoor classroom, where hands-on learning and nature go hand in hand. The benefits of outdoor learning are countless: it allows us to practice social skills, build curiosity, and engage in new ways with concepts we're learning. The fresh air and open space help the children feel grounded and ready to explore. Some of the activities we've been enjoying include sorting natural objects, graphing what we find/like, creating patterns, and drawing or recording our observations. As a family, try the prompt: find 2 things. How are they the same? How are they different?





WHO WE ARE

In Kindergarten, we're exploring some of the First Peoples' Principles of Learning, focusing on how learning is connected to memory, history, and story; how it requires patience and time; and how it helps us explore our identities. Each child has chosen a special tree at Cypress Park to visit throughout the year—a "sit spot" where they can reflect, appreciate nature, and wonder about the world. Ask your child to share which tree they chose and why it felt meaningful to them.

WHO WE ARE

Grade Two created spooky self-portraits in honour of Halloween! We used our self-management skills to follow the plan and our communication skills to discuss the process.

HOW WE ORGANIZE OURSELVES - SPECIAL GUEST! Grade One had some special guests from our community come visit their class today. Firefighters from West Van came to tell us about their role in the community.
