### **HOW WE ORGANIZE OURSELVES**

Third-grade learners are planning Cypress Town and facing difficult decisions. Where should they place the dump? Should they sacrifice the 200-year-old forest or risk polluting the river? Should the dump be located next to the school? The students must collaborate to find a solution to this challenging community issue.















# MAPPING PROJECT AND REFLECTIONS

Learners in grade one worked on creating a map of our school neighbourhood. They had to include spaces and things that help our community function. Students reflected on their social and communication skills when working with their partner on the map.

### **OUTDOOR CAMERAS**

Wonder Walkers by, Micha Archer + Outdoor Cameras I have two big questions that I always ask the students when we are learning, 'What do you notice?' and 'What do you wonder?' We read Wonder Walkers, took our cameras out, and looked and listened for things that made us wonder. The students love the responsibility that their outdoor camera brings focus + perspective.







### DIA DE LOS MUERTOS

The third-grade students enjoyed a presentation by Julia, in which she explained a cultural celebration and tradition that her family observes during this season in Mexico. Many students were able to relate this tradition to other cultural celebrations they are familiar with.

# **PUTTING ACTION INTO RECONCILIATION**

Tsitsáyxemaat (Rebecca Duncan) is a Skwxwú7mesh Sníchim (Squamish Language) speaker and knowledge keeper. She has been speaking the language for nearly 40 years and has created library kits to help revitalize Squamish Nation language and culture.

West Vancouver Memorial Library now has Skwxwú7mesh Sníchim (Squamish Language) kits for people to borrow to help revitalize the language and culture.

### SAMPLE OF WHAT IS IN THE KIT BELOW



Each kit includes a Squamish to English dictionary, an audio player to learn pronunciation, and alphabet blocks showing the letters and numbers of the language. Opposites and animal flashcards, as well as a foraging walk guide learning about land-based teachings, are also included in the kit.

But another component is Stl'ashn Skw'shitsut, also known as Potlatch, a co-operative game that teaches the idea of a shared economy.

The game highlights traditional plants, medicines, customs and cultural elements that are all significant to the Squamish people, said West Vancouver Memorial Library librarian Kendra Sakamoto.


