
HOW WE EXPRESS OURSELVES Exploring Creativity with iPads

This week, we had the exciting opportunity to use iPads in Kindergarten! During our discussions, Caroline shared that An iPad can help us look up and research, Will said its a tool for finding out things we don't know, and Andre

reminded us that an iPad is a learning tool. We also explored an app called ChatterPix Kids, which brought our creativity to life!

As part of the IB program, we focus on developing Approaches to Learning (ATL) skills, and this activity highlights several key areas:

- 1. Communication Skills: Students practice sharing their ideas clearly and creatively using technology.
 - 2. Thinking Skills: They use critical and creative thinking to plan what their character will say.
 - Self-Management Skills: Organizing their thoughts and using the app responsibly are key parts of this activity.





SELF MANAGEMENT SKILLS Yoga Time! Every Friday morning the grade one class spends a few minutes doing Yoga. We are learning about being a Balanced IB learner- giving time for moving our bodies and making brain and body connections.
