


HOW THE WORLD WORKS

NUMERACY

Grade two played a math game called "Bump Up". We used dice shakers to make 2 digit numbers and then bumped the number up 1 and down 1 to make 2 different numbers. In playing the game we practiced our place value (understanding of 10s and 1s). In working with a partner we were COMMUNICATORS as we had to share our thinking, decide how to take turns, and cooperate with each other.
